Highway Marking Uniformity Sought

Salem —P— A step toward uniformity in street and highway traffic marking will be taken Jan. 1 when a manual of State Highway Commission regulations for uniform traffic control devices is distributed to all cities and counties.

State Highway Engineer W. C. Williams said "every motorist has a right to expect that every traffic sign or marking

will have the same meaning, color and shape, and require the same action on his part regardless of where it is encountered."

Under Oregon law the commission is required to establish standards for the design and use of traffic control devices on streets and highways.

The manual will mark the first time a comprehensive volume containing all regulations has been issued.
