Is That So?

Our earth's climate has fluctuated between warm and cold during the millennium—although about nine-tenths of the time mildness has prevailed.

During the warm periods it averaged about the warmth of the tropics; during the cold periods, it was severely cold with sheets of ice creeping into the temperate zones from the two poles.

Judging from the records left—such as oil fields, coal deposits, and coral beds, all of which extend into both polar regions together with the scratches and deposits of ice sheets deep into the temperate zones—we have a fairly good chart today of the earth's climatic history.

Of course when the earth's climate was genial—tending toward torrid—no water was stored in the ice caps with the result that a much greater proportion of the earth's surface was covered with oceans than when it was in its cold period.

Apparently the earth had its first great cold period about 520,000,000 years ago about the time biologists think our first invertebrates appeared. During this cold period, snow fell over a generous portion of the earth. It lasted through the summers, building up layer upon layer

until the pressure on the bottom layers formed ice and these became moving glaciers.

Again Became Warm After many thousands of years the earth again became warm. Glaciers melted and sea advanced—covering most of the U.S. for example. Tropical forests marched northward, flourishing in Pennsylvania and even portions of southern Canada, as remaining coal beds and oil fields attest.

Even this long warm period eventually gave way before another age of cold weather during which snow fell again, glaciers formed, seas receded, and bitter snow-laden blizzards tortured the recently-evolved reptiles and destroyed conifers which were now dotting the northern lands. In this frigid age even the equatorial band running through India, Africa, South America and Australia felt the heavy hand of lasting snows which congealed into glaciers and left their heavier tracks on the tortured land.

This was again followed with a long period of warm weather—say about 150,000,000 years ago. The chances are there was no natural ice on earth at this time. The polar regions sustained a lush tropical life. Even the highest mountains were not high enough for glaciers to begin to accumulate. The sea warmed so that warm-water corals grew as far north as southern Alaska and the British Isles.

Great Ice Age Began This warm period which brought the dinosaurs into the northern river valleys couldn't last and about 500,000 years ago the earth's last great ice age began. Snows fell and glaciers formed and began sliding down from the poles creating tremendous refrigerated areas which bred violent weather.

This last cold period lasted a mere 470,000 years—bringing us up to 30,000 years when the ice began to retreat. Behind the retreating glaciers the warmer climate stimulated the advance of spruce, pine, poplar, birch and grasses on their northward migration.

Where do we stand today regarding an ice age? Scientists say betwixt and between. With the odds a trifle on the retreating ice-age side—a good indication being the level of the sea which is rising about 3 inches a century. (Copyright, 1957, by Eugene Burns)
