**Defense Lawyers To Be Named for Sergeant's Trial**

Washington — Defense lawyers were slated to be named today for the court martial of an Army sergeant accused of spying for Russia under the influence of vodka and sex.

The attorneys face the task of saving M-Sgt. Roy A. Rhodes from possible life imprisonment for actions he committed while serving in the U.S. Embassy's motor pool in Moscow from May, 1951, to July, 1953.

An Army general court martial was ordered Thursday after investigation of charges that the 40-year-old Army veteran had violated U.S. espionage laws and signed a false official document. No trial date was set immediately.

As a witness in the trial of convicted Soviet master spy Rudolph Abel in Brooklyn, N.Y., last October, Rhodes admitted peddling information to the Russians.

He said he became a Russian informer after a wild hotel bedroom party with a Moscow girl. He had an American wife at the time.

Rhodes said he woke up after the party with a Russian woman who started his contact with Soviet agents.

Rhodes testified he had been paid between \$2,500 and \$8,000 for information on the "personal habits" of American embassy civilian and military personnel, on Army assignments he had held and on a code training program he had undergone.

He said "some" of the data given Soviet agents was true.

The rangy, 15-year Army veteran faces a possible maximum penalty if convicted on the spy charge of life imprisonment, dishonorable discharge and forfeiture of all pay and allowances.
