Prevention of Chicken Pox

We doctors have long thought of chicken pox as perhaps the most harmless of all the various diseases of children, but in recent years we have found that in an occasional case the virus of this disease will attack the brain, and will sometimes leave the child badly handicapped. Hence it is good news that Dr. George X. Trimble, now of Long Beach, Calif., reports that an injection of gamma globulin can protect children and grown-ups from getting the disease after they have been exposed to it.

Heredity and Multiple Sclerosis

The question has arisen, might not multiple sclerosis be dependent, at least partly, on heredity? A nation-wide search is now on for like-twins, each with multiple sclerosis. Dr. Roland Mackay, University of Illinois, Chicago, is making the study. So far, 29 pairs of like-twins have been studied in which one twin had the disease. Only two pairs have been found in which each twin has unquestioned multiple sclerosis. Twenty-five pairs of unlike or fraternal twins were found, and among these, there was one pair in which both the persons had multiple sclerosis.

A study of the relatives of a twins showed that multiple sclerosis was from 20 to 33 times more common in

Marshals Debunked By Kansas Historian

Miller notes that the TV sagas twist Kansas history a bit. Nothing to get riled up about, however, and he concedes that it's good publicity. And free, too. But Miller adds:

Historians have you covered. They've drawn a bead on your rootin' tootin' television escapades, figuring it's time for the facts to head you off at the pass.

"A halo on the real Wyatt Earp would have been rankly out of place," says Nyle Miller, secretary of the Kansas Historical society. Kansas is especially interested in the current popularity of these 19th century frontier marshals because it was in Kansas that they did much of their marshaling.

Hamelin, Germany — An American soldier was killed Saturday night when he mistakenly opened an outside door of a moving passenger train and stepped out, police reported Sunday night. They said Pvt. Harry Clayevand (home address unavailable), attached to a U.S. engineer battalion near Frankfurt, on his first leave in Europe, apparently mistook the outside door for the door to the men's room.

That historical societies must preserve factual history, and leave the fantasies to TV programs.

Take Wyatt Earp. On TV for the past two years, he has been marshal of Wichita. Miller says Earp was actually in Wichita less than a year, and only as an assistant marshal. He was fired in 1876 for getting into an election day brawl.

After that, he moved over to Dodge City and served as deputy marshal for four years under Bat Masterson. According to newspaper accounts of the time Wyatt once ran afoul of a musician at Dodge City dancehall girl, Frankie Bell. He belted her and was fined one dollar for the saloon melee.

Why, he was tossed into jail in 1877 for a bloody street fight in Dodge City with Sheriff Larry Decker. Bat was fined \$25. Six months later, the voters of Dodge City put him in as sheriff.

In 1880, Bat checked in his star and reportedly became a faro dealer in the southwest.

Indians Run Wild In East Ecuador

Quito, Ecuador — Yumbo Indians on the warpath in the wilds of eastern Ecuador have killed at least 11 persons in the past two months, it was reported Saturday.

Msgr. J. Spiller, a Catholic official touring missions in the eastern jungles, reported by radio that the Yumbos killed 10 settlers at the Forks of the Oglan and Curaray rivers Dec. 18.

Earlier, Spiller said, the Indians had killed a "half-civilized tribesman" who aided two women of the Auca tribe, traditional enemy of the Yumbos.
