Increase in Tree Farms Reported

Portland — A net increase of 158 units during 1957 brought the Western Pine tree farm roll to 1,279, totaling 6,490,546 acres, E. L. Kolbe, chief forester for the Western Pine association, has reported.

Idaho and Washington led the 1957 increase with a net gain of 62 tree farms each, while California led in acres added, 139,014. In total number of certified Western Pine tree farms, Idaho continues to lead with 655, Washington being second with 245, California third with 198 and Oregon fourth with 107.

Lymphosarcoma, Lymphoma, and Hodgkin's Disease

There are many types of cancer because a cancer can arise in practically every one of the many different tissues of the body. For instance, an epithelioma (oma means a tumor) arises in the epithelium, or the skin, or the lining of the lip, or the tongue.

Sarcomas arise in non-glandular tissues, such as muscles and bone. They are found often in young persons. The lymphomas and Hodgkin's disease arise in what is called lymphoid tissue—the tissue that makes up much of the so-called glands in the sides of our neck and in the groin and the arm-pit.

root of the nerve, either at the base of the brain or at the side of the spinal cord. The little blisters follow the course of the affected nerve. In young people, the blisters soon dry up, and usually that's the end of the trouble. But, as I have to keep saying in this column in cases of older persons the pain produced by shingles can go on for many months. Then, usually, there isn't much that the physician can do locally to give relief. Usually, he has to give the patient pain-relievers.

It is questionable if measures applied to the painful area can do any good because the disease is not there, it is up in the nervous system. It may even be up as high as the brain. And yet, some persons have written to say that they were helped by having the doctor inject procain under the affected area of skin, or by having him cool the skin with an ethyl-chloride spray. One patient wrote that he got great relief from applying a vibrator over the area. Some have gotten help from injections of small-pox vaccine or diptheria antitoxin.

Burning Tongue So many persons around the age of 50 complain of a burning tongue. It annoys them a great deal, and yet absolutely nothing wrong can be seen on the tongue. There is no ulceration or anything to show. After seeing hundreds of these cases, I am satisfied that the trouble is back

Under such circumstances, one cannot expect to find any medicine that will do any good, and, actually, I never did find or hear of any drug that would give these unhappy people the

least relief. The distress usually continues for months or years.
