

Daily Worker To Quit Publication In U. S. Monday

New York — The Daily Worker, Communism's bankrupt American mouthpiece, will cease publication next Monday because Moscow will no longer back its "Doubting Thomas" editor.

The newspaper announced Wednesday that its Jan. 13 edition marking its 34th anniversary will be its last. The Communists will continue to publish the Weekly Worker, which was formerly the Worker's week end edition with a circulation of about 13,000.

Whether John Gates, editor of the Worker, will continue as editor of the Weekly Worker was still in doubt. Gates led the "freedom from Moscow movement at the American Communist Party convention last February and subsequently made the newspaper a forum of criticism of the party line as dictated by the Kremlin.

Shaken By Repression

Gates' faith was shaken by Russia's bloody repression of the Hungarian revolution in 1956. The fact that he aired his doubts on the editorial page of the Worker ended his usefulness to the Kremlin.

The suspension of the newspaper was interpreted as a victory for former Communist Party chairman William Z. Foster, a stiff-backed Stalinist who has been ousted from the party's high command by the Gates faction. According to all indications, Foster retained enough power to cut off the financial backing which the Worker received from the party's secret reserve fund of \$500,000 to \$1 million.

Can't Meet Deficit

"We have been informed by the Communist Party that it is not in a position to help raise the large amounts needed immediately to meet our deficit, which ran to \$250,000 in 1957," the Daily Worker announced. "It is pointed out that lower party membership, diminished resources and unresolved party differences combine to bring about an unsatisfactory situation."

Florida Citrus Industry Faces Complete Ruin

A cold snap settled over the snow-laden East Coast today, putting Florida's billion-dollar citrus industry in danger of complete ruin.

Temperatures plummeted during the night from Maine to Florida, with the most noticeable drops occurring in New England. The U. S. Weather Bureau reported that nighttime temperatures were generally about 20 degrees lower than a day earlier, and that near-zero readings were common.

44 Victims Counted
The United Press counted at least 44 weather victims since the snow and cold weather hit Tuesday. They included 20 deaths from traffic or heart attacks in New England, 6 in New York and 3 in New Jersey and highway deaths in Pennsylvania, Iowa and Wisconsin. In addition, there were 11 fire victims, 4 in Virginia, 1 in North Carolina and 6 in Midwest, and an airman died in a Florida plane crash during a rainstorm.

Atlantic City, N.J., buried under 11 inches of snow, described the surprise storm as the worst in 30 years, and Connecticut authorities said it was almost a decade since similar snow depths had piled up from a single storm.

Warming Trend
Warming was in store for most of the nation except the New England and Mid Atlantic Coast states, with snow flurries seen only in the Northern Rockies.

A general warming trend from the Great Lakes through the Mississippi Valley and most of the Plain States continued, accompanied in many places by fair skies. Some showers were seen in the far Northwest near the coast to round out the weather picture.

Another Penguin Dies From Lung Disease
Portland — Another Emperor penguin died Wednesday night, leaving 15 Emperors and 10 Adelle penguins here. Twelve penguins have died here since they were brought from the South Pole region in November. Aspergillosis, a lung disease, is blamed for their deaths.

Portland — Barge traffic dropped off about one per cent at Bonneville dam lock but gained four per cent at The Dalles dam in 1957 compared with 1956, Army engineers said.

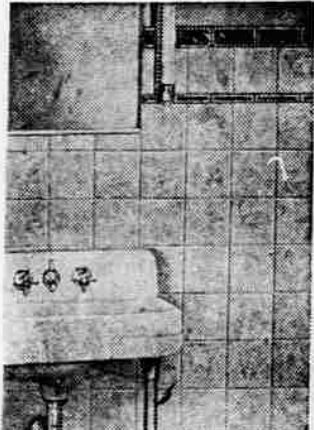

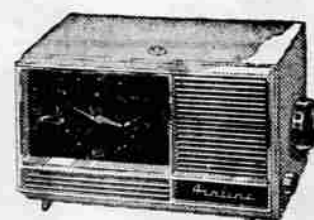
