My brother and I were always very close because we are only a year apart in age. I always looked forward to our being the best of friends—even after our marriages. No Medical Treatment

For Fibroids:
A woman asks me for medicine for "fibroid" tumors on her womb, and I have to say there isn't any such drug that I know of.

These tumors are just lumps of muscle which ordinarily do no harm, and almost never turn into cancer. Every third woman has fibroids, so they can hardly be looked on as a disease, unless they begin to cause the woman to bleed so badly that she becomes anemic.

Good gynecologists tell me that less and less often do they operate for "fibroids," and they are particularly reluctant to remove the uterus from a woman under the age of 40. They do not perform a hysterectomy unless certain complications compel them to do it. I can understand why they have come to dread such operations, because almost every mail brings me sad and heart-rending letters from women who so wish now they never had had the operation.

Here is a letter from a woman who had all her pelvic organs out when she was 26. Although she loves her husband, she lost all of her sexual feeling, and worse yet, she now can hardly stand to have her nice young husband touch her. She has such terrible flushes she can hardly sleep at night, and she is at times so depressed she would gladly be dead.

As she says now, "If I had known how extensive the operations was going to be, and what it would do to me, and my marriage I would gladly have stood what pain I had and what flooding I had each month."

Operation Often Needed
Many of my surgeon friends may write to remind me that often the operation is much needed. Of course it is; I am not talking of such cases. I am talking of young women whose fibroid, though large, was causing no symptoms. Unfortunately, there are still a few surgeons who think, by removing a silent fibroid, they can cure the woman's sick headaches or her feelings of fatigue, or her great nervousness, or her depression, or

Perhaps they enclose pictures of two or three lovely children whom they would never have had, if years before I hadn't said, "If I were you, I'd wait." Their letters make me happy.

I so admire those many surgeons who today say to many a woman, "No surgery for you," and who say this even when they know the chances are she will go elsewhere and get someone to perform the operation she thinks will cure her nervousness. It would be wonderful if our women only knew that there is no operation that will change a sickly Pomeranian into a powerful bulldog!
