Cottage Grove — A Scottsburg logger and his wife Thursday turned over to police here four Cottage Grove children missing from their homes since New Year's day.

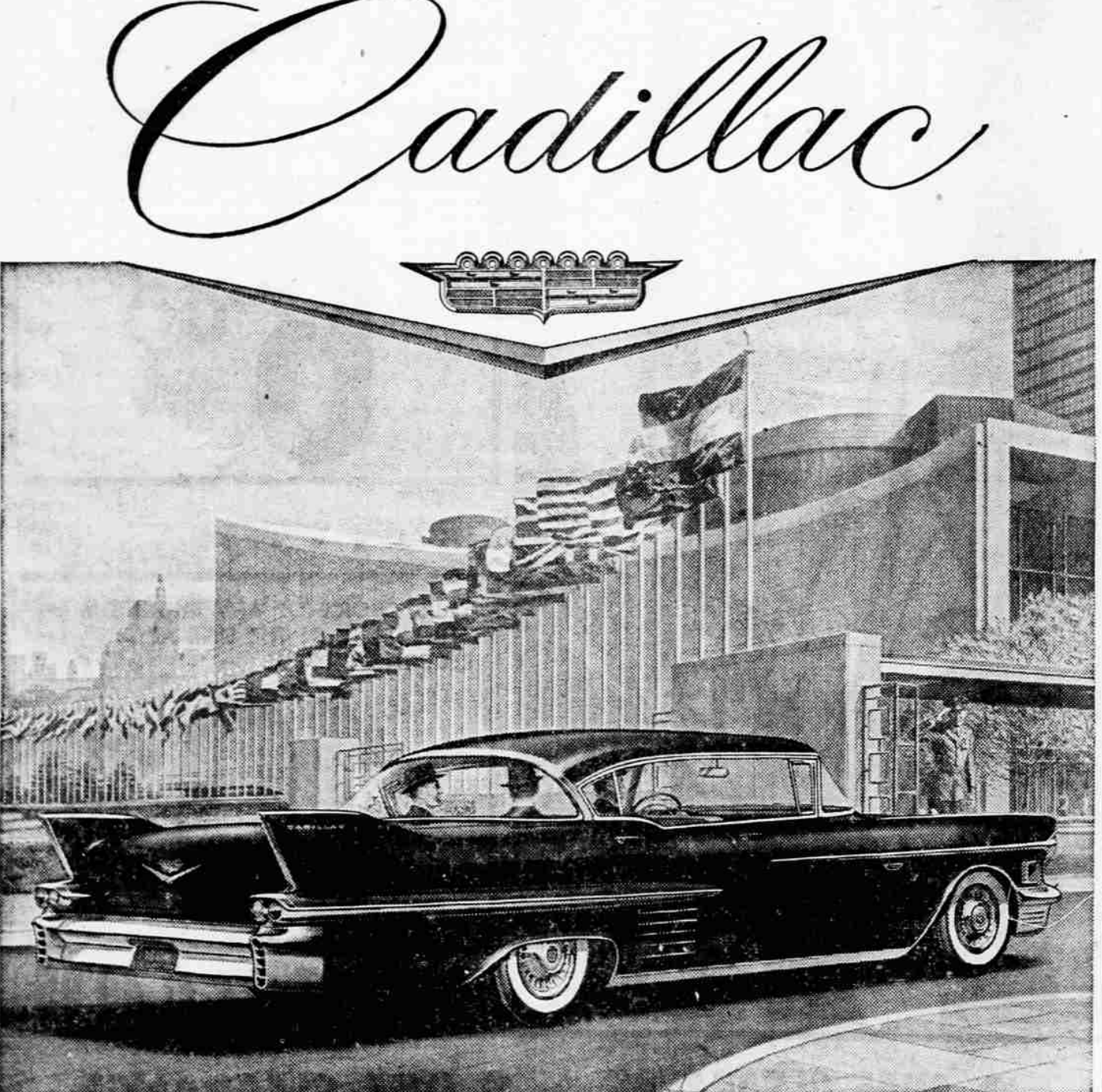
Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Whitlow told officers the youngsters, who had run away from home, had stayed with them since Whitlow had picked them up the morning of January 1 on old Highway 99 just south of here.

The children were 11-year-old Lloyd Douglas Williams; his two sisters, Geraldine, 13, and June, 14; and Nancy Whitted, 14, a neighbor girl.

The Whitlows said they did not realize the seriousness of keeping the runaway children until they saw pictures of them in the newspapers. Mrs. Whitlow told police the children "were unhappy at home. They were well behaved and willing workers." The Whitlows have two children of their own.

Police returned the Williams boy to the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Odus Williams, but the girls were detained for questioning. The Whitted girl is the daughter of William H. Whitted of Cottage Grove. Her mother lives in California.

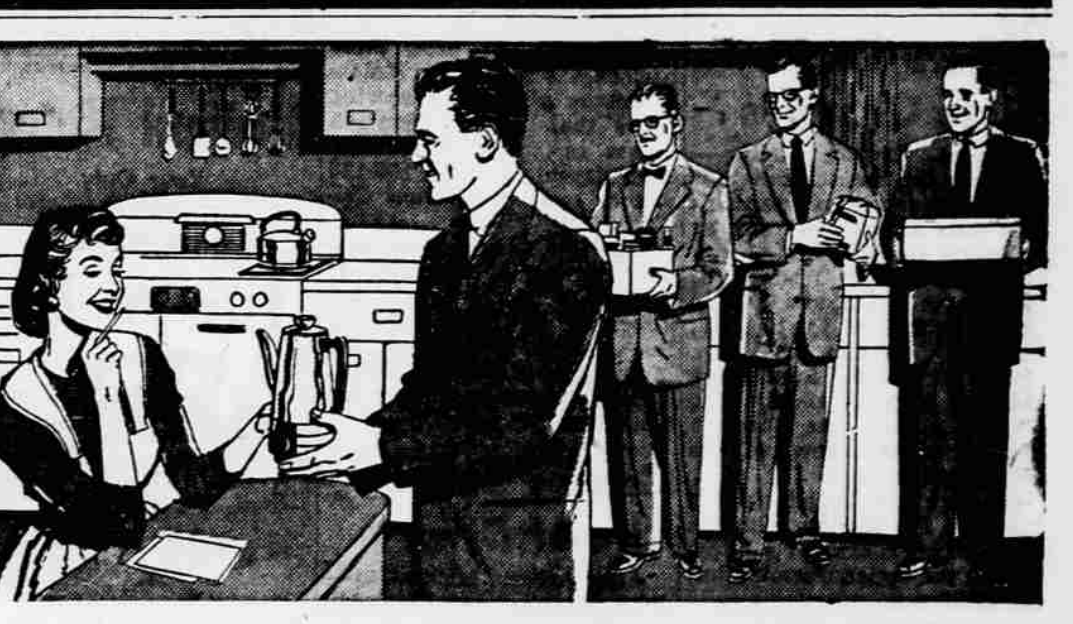
