It sounds as though he has maneuvered himself into a painful, humiliating situation, from which he can dream about the never-never land of a happy job.

No, we don't think nagging is good for Henry's morale, but we think he should try to confront by himself some of the painful questions his wife raises. Why does he work for less and less pay, when he should be improving his skills and earning more as the years go on? Why does he work on a level below his ability and educational background? Specifically, what form of happiness does he expect from his job?

Henry needs to re-evaluate his situation and determine a course that will bring him a degree of success in some area.

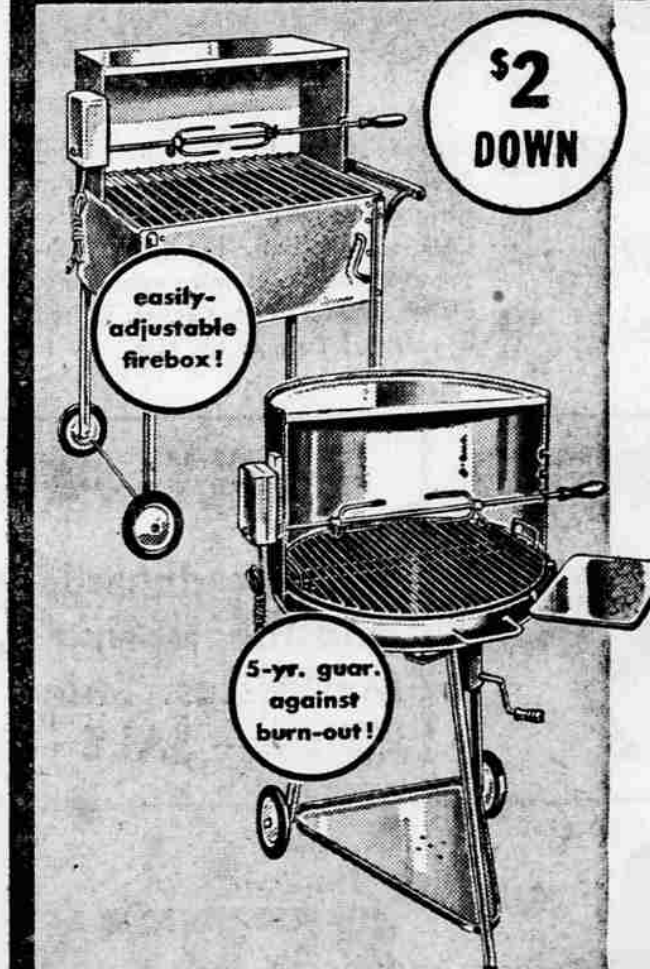

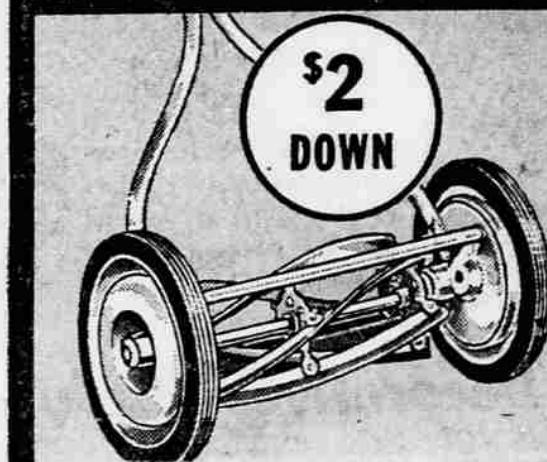
