If you use on the new fabric softeners on washday, add it to the final clear water after all traces of soap or detergent suds have been rinsed away. 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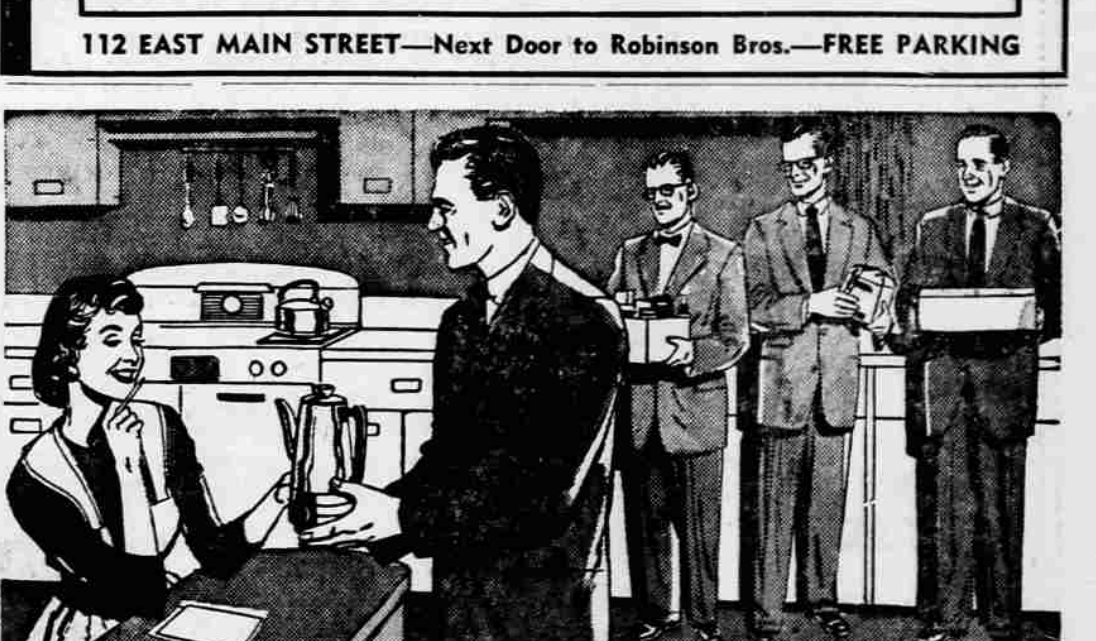
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
