Malibu, Calif.—Sarah Churchill, after pleading guilty to a drunkenness charge:  
"I was more ill than drunk . . . I deeply regret the trouble I have caused the community and the court. It is painful to myself and those I love."

London—British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan, in his letter to Soviet Premier Nikolai Bulganin pledging non-aggression:  
" . . . No British government will ever commit, take part in or condone an act of aggression against the Soviet Union."

Hollywood—Screen Producer's Guild President Jan Engel, in a final tribute to film pioneer Jesse L. Lasky Sr.:  
"He was taller than some of us but he never looked down on anyone. He walked with dignity among men."

Phoenix, Ariz.—Arkansas Gov. Orval Faubus, in discussing the dumping of a bowl of soup by a white student at Little Rock, Ark., Central high school on a Negro student:  
" . . . There isn't harmony in the school and where there is disharmony those things will occur."

Vienna, Austria — Hungarian Deputy Premier Ferenz Muennich, when asked by newsmen whether Hungary would attempt to force the U.S. legation in Budapest to surrender Josef Cardinal Mindszenty who has taken refuge there since the Hungarian freedom revolt:  
"He can stay there until he goes to heaven."

Maxton, N.C.—Police Chief Bob Fisher, on reports that Maxton's large Indian population is heavily armed and on the warpath against the Ku Klux Klan:  
"We have always had good race relations here and we don't intend to let any outside group stir up trouble with our Indians."

### Hungarian Revolt List Burning Urged

United Nation, N.Y.—A United Nations investigating committee has recommended that U.N. political officer Povl Bang-Jensen burn the secret list of Hungarian revolt witnesses which he refuses to surrender.

The committee said the Danish official refused to give it the list just as he earlier refused to turn it over to the United Nations. He based his

refusal on the contention it might fall into the hands of Communists and lead to reprisals against the witnesses or their families in Hungary. The investigators said they were convinced the paper have no further use because their "validity has been impaired if not destroyed by his manner of dealing with them."

### Los Angeles Man Appears In Court

Joe Glaszko, 27, of Los Angeles, Calif., pleaded guilty to charges of being a fugitive from justice in district court Wednesday and was sentenced to 30 days in the county jail by District Court Judge James M. Main.

Glaszko, who was arrested by Medford police Jan. 10, on a disorderly conduct charge, was found to be wanted by California authorities on a non-support charge.

The sentence was suspended when he was returned to California by a member of the Los Angeles police department.

Diseases discussed will include hepatitis, meningitis, venereal diseases, tularemia, or rabbit fever, psittacosis or parrot fever, rabies, tetanus and undulant fever.

The panel of doctors who will discuss aspects of the diseases are Dr. Wayne E. Roberts, physician and surgeon of Central Point, Dr. Dwight H. Findley, physician and surgeon, and Dr. A. Erin Merkel of the health department. Mrs. Ivan Burton of the Jackson County Public health association will moderate the program.

### Appointments to Boards Planned

Applications for appointment to precinct election boards will be accepted by the county clerk starting Jan. 20. Mrs. Bereth Hopkins, Jackson county clerk, has announced. Applications will be accepted until Jan. 30.

Appointments will be made for two years ending Dec. 31, 1959. Boards in Jackson county will have four members, Mrs. Hopkins noted. Consultations will be held with former election board chairmen, she said, and recommendations may be made by political party central committee chairmen. Law requires that not all members of the board shall be of the same political party. Recommendations will be

given due consideration, Mrs. Hopkins said, but will not necessarily determine who will be appointed. The responsibility for making appointments is with the county clerk.

Schools of instruction will be held for election board members to prepare them for election day duties, she added. The primary election is May 16, and the general election is Nov. 4.

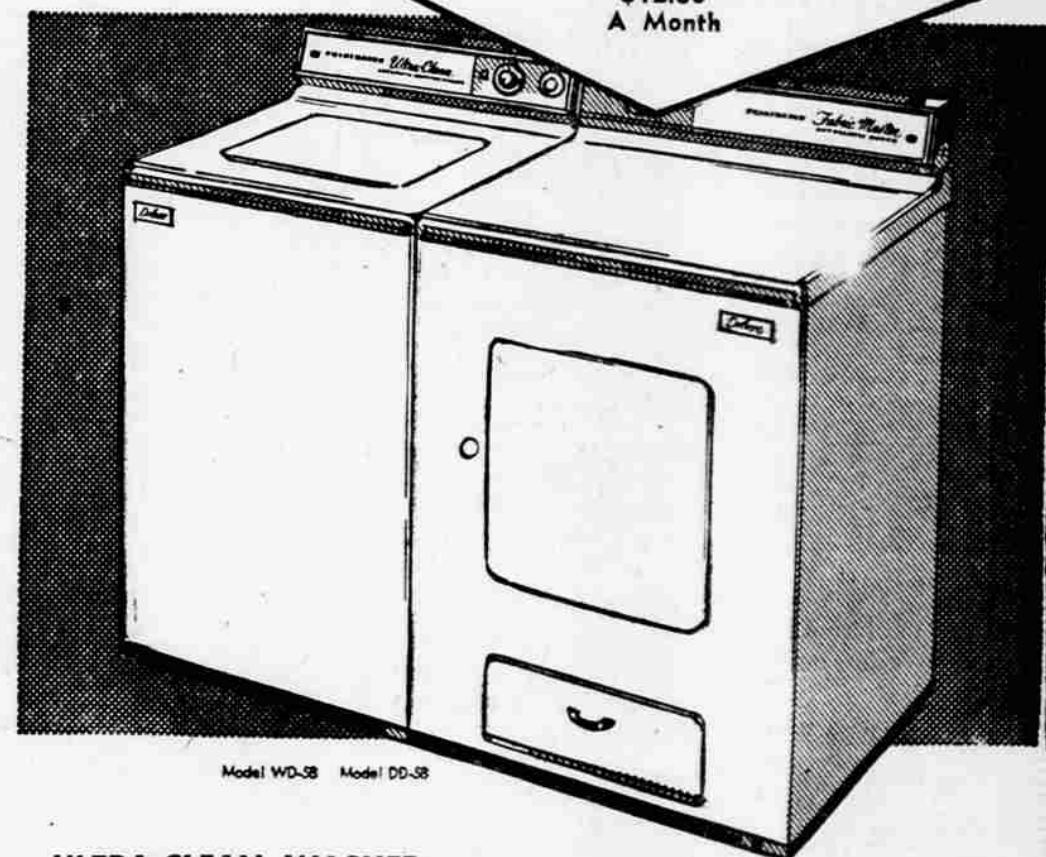

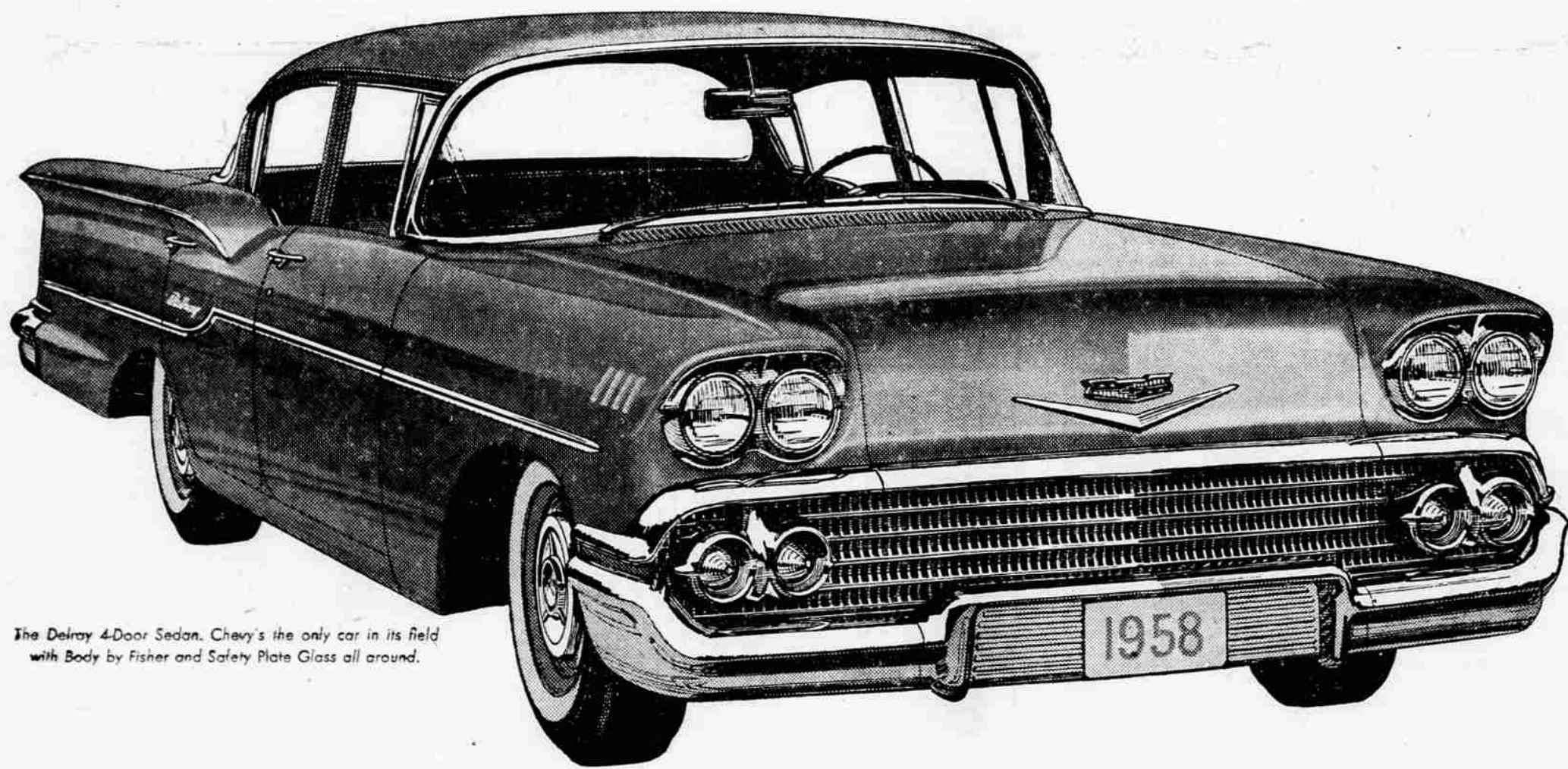
