Chicago — C. N. Sayen, president of the Air Line Pilots association said Wednesday night a threatened walkout of 263 pilots of Western Air Lines will go ahead as planned.

"The company must bear full responsibility for the action it has forced its pilots to take by its complete failure to deal with the issues," Sayen said.

Roots Too Deep Hamper Peonies

Madison, Wis. — A University of Wisconsin floriculturist says the most common cause for poor peony development is planting the roots too deep.

Lou Berninger said the buds of the plant should be under only one and a half inches of soil when planted and packed firmly to prevent the roots from settling later.

Peonies grow best in full sunlight and in a well-drained location, the plant specialist said. Fall is the best season for transplanting peonies, although they need to be transplanted only every six to ten years.

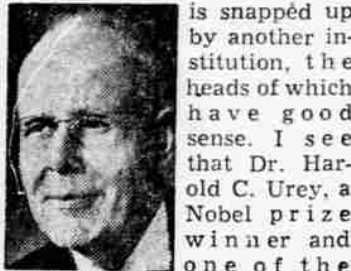

Dr. Urey on Retirement Gets a New Job

I am delighted when I see that a youngish and still able man who has been retired because of the stupid "age limit"

is snapped up by another institution, the heads of which have good sense. I see that Dr. Harold C. Urey, a Nobel prize winner and one of the greatest chemists in the world, is to be retired from the University of Chicago next April just because the calendar says he is 65. The fact that he is still young and active and capable of inspiring and helping many young research workers is not supposed to influence the managing heads of the university. All they are supposed to see is the figure 65. They appear to be sharing in the delusion so widespread today, that all men at 65 are equally old and worn-out and useless to their organization.

Everyone with any sense knows that some men are worn-out and useless and a drag on their organization when they are 40, while others are still full of energy and drive when they are 75. Often today when a very able man is retired at 65, he is snapped up by another institution in which he becomes a tower of strength.

Now I read that Dr. Urey has been given a professorship at the University of California where he can continue his work until he is 70. As many indignant professors at the University of Chicago are saying, Dr. Urey would be of great value to the school if only he were to sit in his office and attract scores of able young graduate students, and help them with advice and suggestions.

Asked To Stay On

Fortunately, today in some businesses the very able man with tremendous "know-how" when retired officially at 65, is asked to stay on as a technical advisor. Especially in great research laboratories, the old chief is asked to keep coming down to his office where he can be consulted by the young workers when they need help with one of their problems.

Some of my readers may ask, "But why are the 'top brass' of a company so stupid as to let out a man of tremendous value to their organization?" One answer is that the younger men want to keep moving up the ladder of promotion. This is arranged for in many organizations by relieving an executive of administrative duties when he gets to be 55 or 65, and giving his job and title to one of the men he has trained. After that, the older man is used as a consultant, planner, advisor and trouble-shooter.

Immunizing Injections

Mothers ask me when their baby should have immunizing shots, and which ones he should have. I feel this should be left to the judgment of the pediatrician. I do feel that it is very important that the child have these injections. I was reading the other day that in a city in which many people have become lax about anti-diphtheria protection, the health authorities suddenly found on their hands a bad epidemic of diphtheria. This, of course, was unjustifiable. If every mother were to see to it that her infant was immunized to diphtheria the disease would soon disappear off the face of the earth. Actually, it has almost disappeared in highly civilized countries.

Medford Pears on Display at Meeting

Medford pears will be a featured part of the fruit display at the 54th annual convention of the United Fruit and Vegetable association in San Francisco later this month, according to members of the Medford Pear Shippers association.

The pears will be furnished by local shippers as part of the display of the Oregon-Washington-California Pear bureau. About 70 boxes of Bosc, Comice and D'Anjou will be used in the display and sampling exhibit.

The pears will be shipped to arrive in San Francisco Jan. 26 in prime condition, industry spokesmen said. The convention is scheduled Jan. 27 through 30.

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Left-Hand Writers Could Do Better

Chicago — The handwriting of lefties can be better than that of their right-handed counterparts, a Pennsylvania school teacher recently concluded.

The teacher, Eric A. Endstrom, a right-hander from Gettysburg, Pa., presented his eight-year study of southpaw penmanship to the annual convention of the handwriting Foundation.

The survey, which he used as a doctor of philosophy dissertation at the University of Pittsburgh, pointed out that 11 per cent of today's children are portersiders, compared with only four per cent noted in previous surveys.

"It's partly because teachers are becoming aware that they shouldn't try to change people who are left-handed," Endstrom said.
