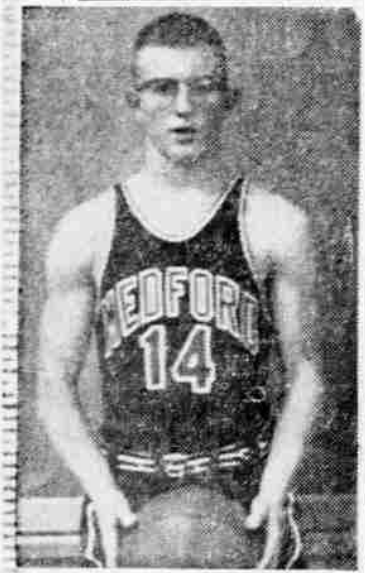


Tornado, Grizzly Court Quints To Contend Tonight, Saturday

Medford Black Tornado hoopsters gun for their first Southern Oregon conference victory of the season tonight and further aim for a series sweep that could put them in the thick of the race for the league and district championship they relinquished last year.

Tornado basketballers go to Ashland this evening and entertain the Grizzlies here Saturday. Game time on both occasions is to be 8:15 p.m.

The Medfordites have their chore cut out for them against Ashland which is a strong contender in what may prove one of the tightest races in years in the conference. Most prognosticators figure Klamath Falls will take the title but there's still a hard battle for second place which also means a state tourney berth. Ashland, which came close to handing Klamath its come-appearance last week, has estab-

lished itself as a leading candidate for second spot, despite a loss to Crater. Tornado chances for a fourth consecutive journey to the Oregon high school basketball tournament may be much better known to Medford fans after this week end's games. However, Medford this year fields an inexperienced crew which may make its strongest showing in the late season.

While Ashland was giving the Pelicans of Klamath a battle last week, the Tornado was picking some valuable seasoning in a non-league series with South Eugene, which ranks with the Pels

Harold Johnson Team Trap Bout Favorite Mix Sunday

Syracuse, N.Y. — Harold Johnson, whose light heavyweight career once soured on a doped orange, is a 3-1 favorite to whip Bert Whitehurst, an unranked heavyweight, tonight at War Memorial auditorium. The 10-round bout will be televised nationally (NBC) at 10 p.m., e.s.t. Johnson, a rangy Philadelphia, is back in his No. 1 contender's position in the light-heavy ranks behind champion Archie Moore. Kiner Foresees Success in PCL
