## The Medical Roundup

### THE FAT CHILD

I recently read several papers in a symposium in the Journal of Pediatrics on the management of the fat child. Hundreds of thousands of mothers are distressed when they see one of their children growing enormously stout. If it is a girl, they know that if she goes on the way she is going, by the time she is 16, she'll be a baby elephant; she will never have a beau, and she will never be married.

Dr. Ella Hill, of Des Moines, says that some babies in the first few months of life begin to put on excess weight, but obesity is seen most frequently between the ages of 8 and 14 years. Fortunately, after this period, quite a few of the fat youngsters lose weight again, spontaneously.

As Dr. Hill says, thousands of the mothers bring these children to the doctor fully expecting that he will find some glandular deficiency, and especially, something wrong with the thyroid gland. But, as she says, such disease is extremely rare. Dr. Edward Rynearson says that even with the huge human material they see at the Mayo Clinic, they rarely can demonstrate anything wrong with the glands of a fat child. The only trouble with him (her) is that his appetite is too good. Children with a certain disease of the pituitary gland and also of an adrenal gland will get fat, but they will develop changes in their body which an expert easily recognizes at a glance. A child whose thyroid gland is so insufficient that he gets fat generally has a sluggish mind and a pale and cold skin. He is pudgy about the eyes and he goes to sleep in his chair. Usually, the typical fat child, with normal glands, grows big and tall; he is alert, wide-awake, has a ruddy complexion, and in some ways is too healthy. His basal metabolic rate is normal, and there is nothing wrong with him except that he is too hungry and too fat.

### Young Oregonians Get Overseas Job

Salem, Ore. — Three Oregon young people have been selected by Gov. Robert D. Holmes to serve as state "Ambassadors" and U.S. Exhibit guides at the Brussels World Fair.

They are Mr. and Mrs. Gary R. Gregory, both 23, and students at the University of Oregon, and Marcia Mauney, 22, Coquille, currently enrolled at the Sorbonne, University of Paris. The trio will represent the state for six months at the Fair starting April 10. Each will receive \$150 a month, living accommodations, \$5 a day allowance toward living expenses and round-trip transportation to the fair.

Many of these unfortunate children are born with an inherited tendency to overweight. As a physician, I seldom feel like examining such a child. I just look at the fat mother, the fat father or the fat grandparents and I see that the cards were stacked against the poor youngster. The great trouble that parents face with these children is that it is almost impossible to get them to cut down on their diet as they should. One cannot watch the child all the time. Because the child must have enough protein, he should be given skim milk, fish, poultry and eggs to give strength, and then enough salads and vegetables and fruits to fill his stomach. He must leave alone cream, rich gravies, oily salad dressings, much butter, potatoes, spaghetti, macaroni, cakes, cookies, bread-stuffs and sweets. He must keep away from candy stores and soda fountains.

I am glad to see that Dr. Hill is against giving children drugs that may lessen their appetite. The great trouble with giving people drugs is that they want to depend on the drug and not on dieting. This they cannot do successfully. Obese Parent

Dr. Barton Childs of Johns Hopkins University has said that about 70 per cent of fat persons have an obese father or mother. If both parents are much over-weight, three out of four of their children are likely to be fat. If one parent is overweight, one out of two of the children may be fat, and if neither parents is over-weight, their children have only one chance in 10 of getting fat.

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## Jason Lee Relative Dies In Portland

Portland — Funeral services will be held Tuesday for Miss Ethel Waif Grubbs, 88, a granddaughter of Jason Lee, the pioneer Oregon Methodist missionary.

She was a graduate of the New England Conservatory of Music and Dramatic Arts at Boston and was once associated with her father in the Marsh Printing company in Portland. She died Thursday at her home here.

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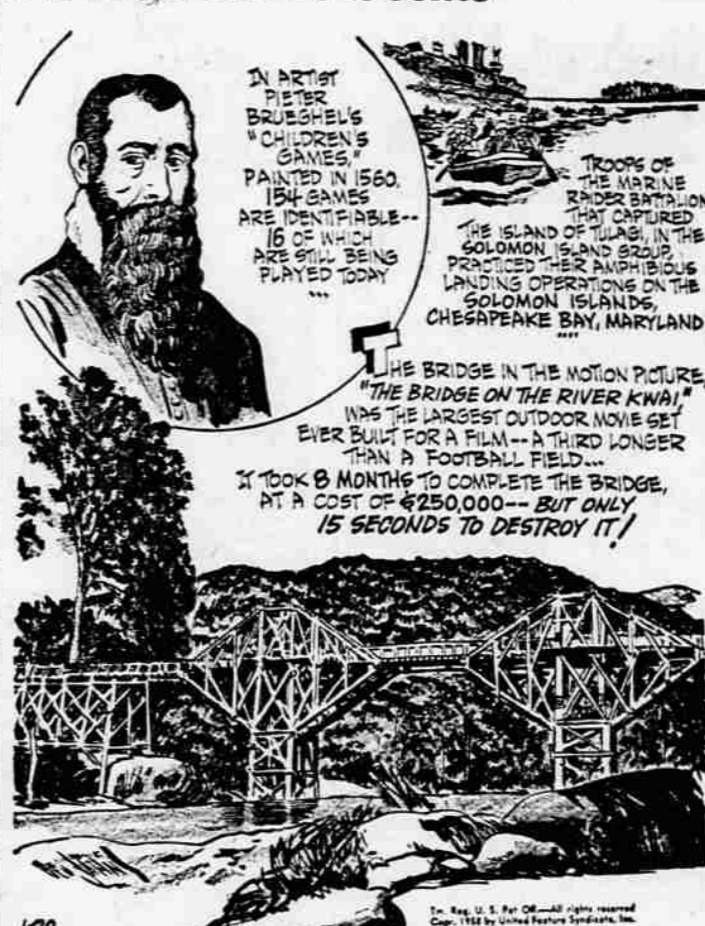
