Cutting The Vagus Nerves For Ulcer

People ask me if cutting the vagus nerve is a "fool-proof cure for ulcer" and I have to answer that some of the most unhappy people I have ever known were people who had had their nerves cut. Several surgeons have told me that they have had so many poor results with the operation that they now seldom perform it. They perform it only when the patient is desperate and there is nothing else left to do. I just saw a woman who had this operation performed a year ago. She says the new ulcer which has formed is so much more painful and crippling, that she now wishes devoutly that she had put up with the situation as it was.

Undescended Testicle in Boys

About one boy in 10 is born without his testicles down in the scrotum or sac where they belong. By the time of adolescence only about 2 in 1,000 boys have their testicles up in the abdomen. Parents should always insist when a testicle has not come down by the age of 10, that the boy be operated on to see if the condition can be rectified. Sometimes there is a rupture in the groin associated with the failure of descent of the testicle, and this should be repaired. There is a danger of cancer developing in an undescended testicle. To my way of thinking, the worst danger to a boy whose testicles haven't come down is that when his fellow students discover his defect and start jeering at him, he will become psychologically upset. He will become silent and glum and solitary, and he won't go out with either boys or girls. The psychology of such a boy changes remarkably the day his testicles are brought down by a surgeon.

I recently read that about 11 per cent of cancerous tumors of the testicle are found in testicles that were allowed to remain up in the abdomen. The bringing of the testicle down does not always prevent the development of cancer in it, but if the testicle is down in place, the chances of finding the tumor in time so as to save the life of the lad are immensely better. One difficulty about leaving the testicles in the abdomen is that they are likely to stop making spermatozoa and, as a result, the lad will grow up to be sterile. Then, if he marries, he will not beget children.

Dr. Robert E. Gross, the great expert at the Children's Medical Center in Boston, prefers to operate on these boys when they are around 9, 10 or 11. Dr. Gross and Dr. E. C. Jewitt Jr., of Buffalo, have found that 79 per cent of their patients who had both testicles brought down were fertile 10 or more years later.

Some physicians advise waiting until the boy is 15 or older to see if the testicles will come down by themselves, but after seeing the utter misery of these boys when their playmates start to jeer, I would urge every parent of such a lad to have him operated on when he is 10, or as soon as he starts to become solitary and mentally disturbed. It is a cruel thing to leave such a boy unoperated on; no parent should ever let his boy suffer for lack of the needed operation.

Wooden Cross Burned at Bend

Bend — Police and firemen were still puzzled today about the burning of an 18-foot wooden cross on a high butte at the east city limits of Bend Saturday night.

The cross, solidly built of two-by-four timbers and wrapped with sacks saturated in stove oil, blazed brilliantly for about 20 minutes and was visible from the downtown Bend area.

Firemen said the cross was on Pilot Butte, a 500-foot peak. They answered a call at 8:17 p.m. to extinguish the blaze.

State policeman Albert Gassner said, "We don't know what it's about yet." Officials said they knew of no Ku Klux Klan organization here. Rather than write the thing off as a prank, Gassner said police and the fire department would continue to investigate the incident.

The cross was removed by the fire department and taken to the fire station for examination.
