Lead Poisoning in Young Children

Few people realize how often small children who chew paint off of a railing get serious lead poisoning with damage to their brain. It is so easy for a child to eat paint off a railing or a window sill after it has cracked in the summer heat and has turned into little flakes. Sometimes, after eating the paint, the child will get such severe abdominal colic that a surgeon will operate, expecting

to find something seriously wrong. In these cases, examination of the blood usually will show changes in the red blood cells, which will suggest lead poisoning. Also, sometimes a bluish so-called "lead line" can be seen in the gums next to the teeth.

The child may become irritable and fretful; he may lose his appetite, and develop indigestion and abdominal discomfort. He may become decidedly constipated and he may vomit. He generally gets pale-looking because of anemia. If he eats enough lead, he may get mental changes with inability to walk straight, and perhaps muscle weakness, delirium, stupor or convulsions. Sometimes an x-ray man will make the diagnosis when he sees an increased density in the growing ends of the long bones. This is due to the presence there of lead. A chemist then can show that there is much lead in the urine.

The clinical picture of lead poisoning in children is usually different from that in adults. In children, the brain is more likely to be injured, while in adults, there is more colic with perhaps pains in the hands and legs. A sad feature about lead poisoning in children is that, unless the doctor who sees this patient is a good diagnostician, he is almost certain to miss the diagnosis. He will fail to think of the possibility, and hence will not order the necessary tests on the blood and the urine. The symptoms are most likely to appear in the summer, when, with the heat of the sun, the paint tends to flake up and become soft so that the child can eat it.

In recent years, in order to protect small children from harm, manufacturers of cribs and toys have used paints free from lead.

Small Veins On A Woman's Thighs

Many women are much distressed over little "spider" veins that can be seen under the skin of their thighs. They want to know if there is any cure. I imagine that if a physician wanted to make a great effort, he might, with the help of a needle cautery, get rid of some of these veins, but it would take time and effort.

Usually, doctors don't care to bother about them. One of the best treatments is to use a water-proof preparation that will cover the veins so they cannot be seen, as when a woman is out swimming. This can be obtained at cosmetic counters and in drug stores.

Zoology Professor At OSC Succumbs

Portland — Dr. Max W. de Laubenfels, 63, professor of zoology at Oregon State college and recognized as an international authority on sponges, died in a Portland hospital Tuesday after a brief illness.

Dr. de Laubenfels, who came to OSC in 1950 from the University of Hawaii, just last week was awarded a Fulbright grant to make a study of Australian sponges, particularly around the Great Barrier reef.

During his scientific career he worked for at least 10 national or international research institutions including the Carnegie Institute and the National Research Council.

Sonia F. — Clara is browbeaten by her husband.

Clara D. — With four children, do I have any alternative?

Sonia F. — I don't want to seem to interfere in anyone's married life, but I can't help worrying about my sister.

Clara is 28 and has four children, so she ought to know a thing or two by now. But she is so browbeaten by her husband it's just awful. She hardly has any spending money — just enough for the daily shopping. If she or the children need clothes, her husband goes to buy them. She wanted some new things for their home, but Mike wouldn't let her buy them — even though he has enough money.

Personally, I wouldn't let any man shove me around like that. I hold the purse strings in my family. That's the way it should be.

Clara D. — I can't see what I'm supposed to do about it if my husband just refuses to turn over his pay check to me. He says his father was always boss in their home and that's the way it should be. No, I don't like it — but what's the use of creating fights? Mike will never give in and I know it.

Clara's problem with her husband is an entirely separate matter. The situation is certainly not pleasant. If Clara can push aside her feelings about what others think, she may be able to concentrate on finding a peaceful way to change things in her home.

Possibly she could interest her husband in the idea of a planned budget. If she can show her husband how she can provide more comforts for the family without being extravagant, he may be willing to give her more say about spending. She should point out that he in no way loses his position as head of the family if she spends on things they both agree are necessary and desirable.

It is doubtful whether it is as more desirable for the woman to have full control over the purse strings than the man. Most men prefer not to be bothered with such matters as household spending. But if Mike is interested, he should be willing to sit down and discuss a reasonable spending program with his wife.
