Urban Planning Contract Authorized

A contract with the University of Oregon bureau of municipal research for urban planning was authorized by the Medford city council Thursday night.

Under the program the treasurer is authorized to deposit \$4,287.50 with the state board of higher education and enter into a formal contract for the work. The program is a matching-fund project in which the city and federal each furnish 50 per cent of the cost.

The contract is due to expire July 13, 1959. Medford is one of 13 Oregon cities recently granted funds to take part in the program. Ned Langford, city planning consultant, will make the study, according to city hall officials. Medford will use its funds for a land-use study, officials said.

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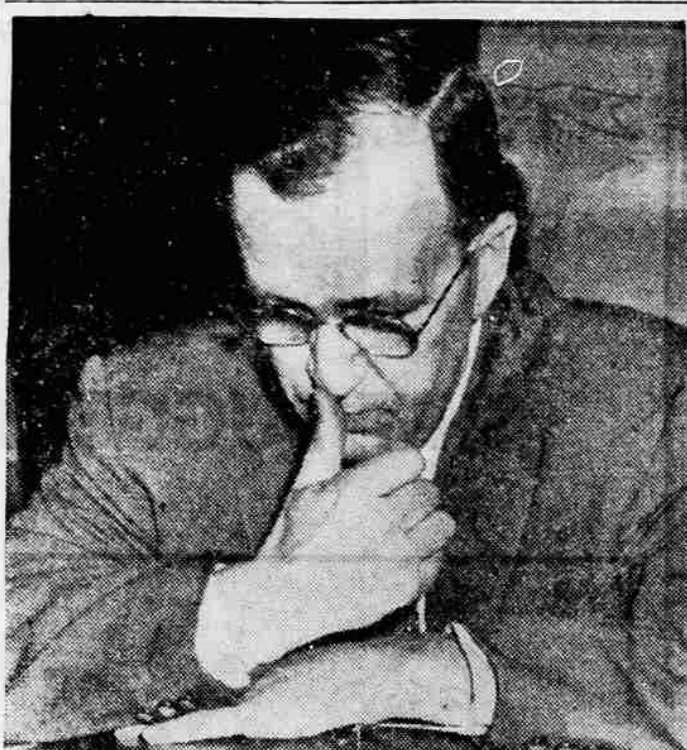

Dallas — The State Rep. Joe Rogers, Independence, indicated Saturday he will file for the Republican nomination for the post sometime this month.
