Oregon Insurance Firms Disclose 'Gimmick' Selling

Portland — Several Oregon insurance firms and the state insurance commissioner revealed today an insurance "gimmick" used by a few new car salesmen to boost their commissions on new car sales.

One insurance firm said it had refunded about \$10,000 to policy holders for the overcharges and another firm said it would refund at least that much to new car buyers who had suffered the overcharge when buying package deal insurance on their new cars.

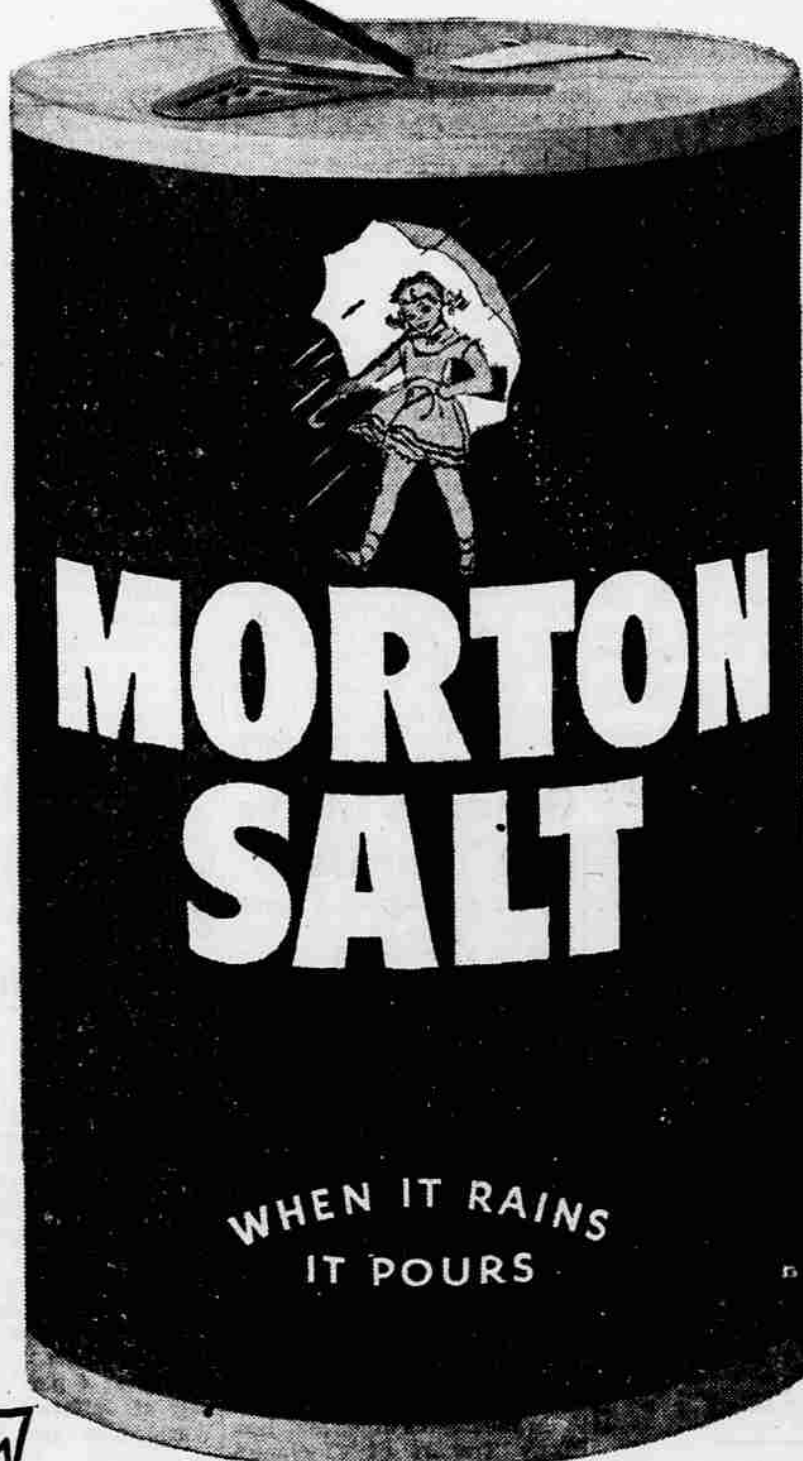
