New York—The King of Swing of the 1930s has agreed to become an atom-age American ambassador of good will.

Benny Goodman, his band, trio and sextet, will give a series of concerts at the Brussels World's Fair during the week of May 25-31, under sponsorship of the Westinghouse Electric Co., the firm's president, Donald H. McGannon announced Thursday. "The great Benny Goodman orchestra... will add a dimension to the Brussels Fair in which the Soviet Union can not compete," McGannon said. "American jazz has been shown to be a great force for good will abroad." The bandleader agreed. "We look upon the Brussels engagement as a real opportunity to foster good will for the United States through music," Goodman said.
