

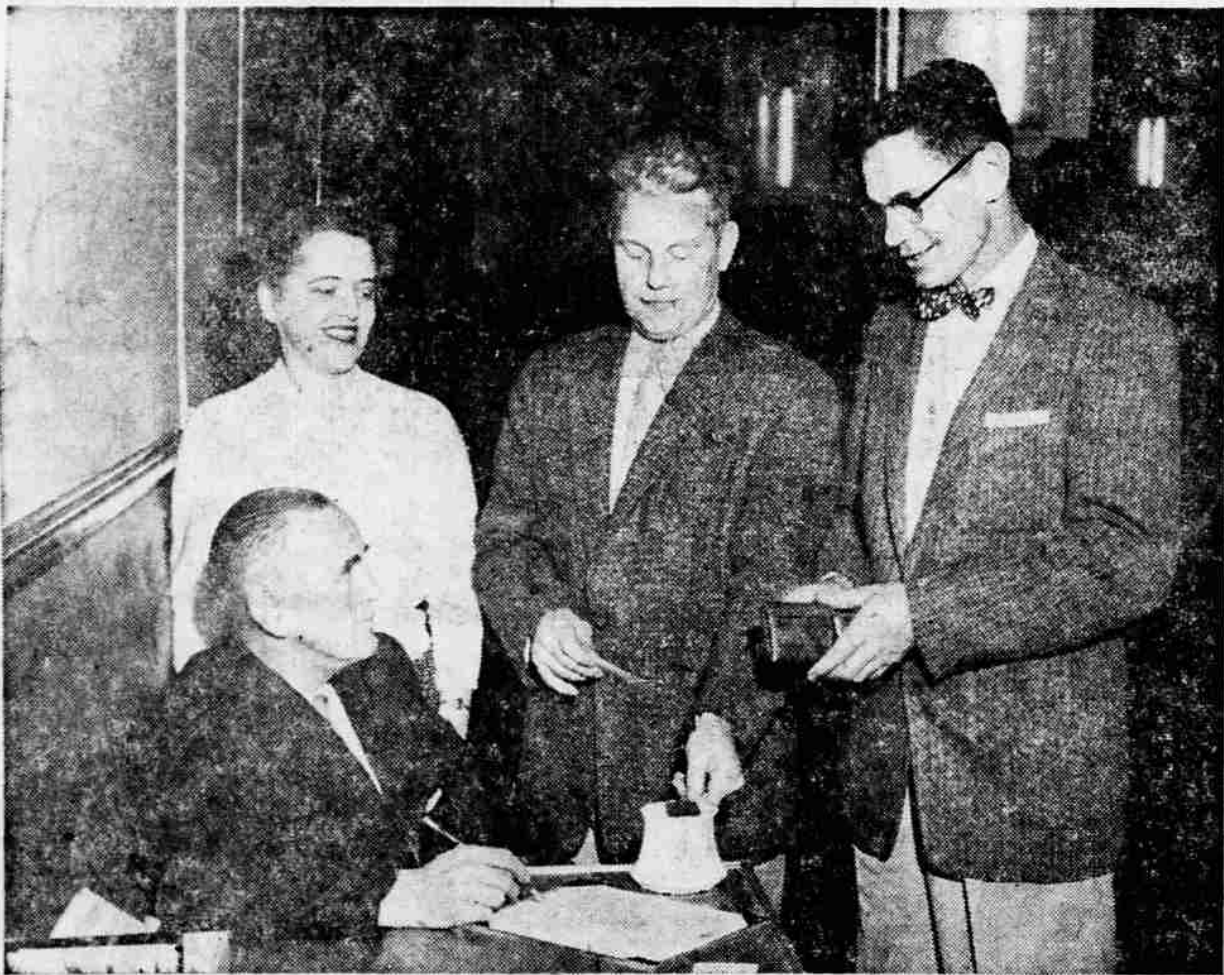
## Pictures of The Week
