President Eisenhower has sent his congratulations to some eleven million members of the National Congress of Parents and Teachers on its 61st anniversary, to be observed Monday, February 17.

In a letter to Mrs. Rollin Brown, Los Angeles, president of the National Congress, Mr. Eisenhower said: "In almost every village, town, and city in America the parent-teacher association is at work advancing our children's welfare." He termed it "a pleasure to congratulate its members through you and to wish them well."

The President's message drew attention to National Congress observance of Founders day, which honors Alice McLellan Birney and Phoebe Apperson Hearst, the two women who inspired its organization in 1897.

Various types of local observances planned by community P.T.A.s were sparked by the Eisenhower statement, which notes:

"As the world's largest voluntary service organization, the P.T.A. has promoted many fine projects on a local level and across the land. Over the years, it has helped in the founding of the first public kindergartens, in supplying

Lenten Main Dish

New York — (UP) — For a Lenten main dish that cooks in less than 10 minutes, try pan fried scallops and scallops.

Wash and dry 1 pound of fresh or thawed frozen scallops. Dip one scallop at a time into 1 egg beaten with 1 tablespoon water, then into a blend of 3/4 cup fine dry bread crumbs, 1/2 teaspoon salt, dash pepper, and 1 teaspoon nutmeg. Cook 1/4 cup chopped scallions in 6 tablespoons butter in large skillet for about 2 minutes. Add scallops and cook 5 minutes longer, turning to brown all sides lightly. Serves 3-4.

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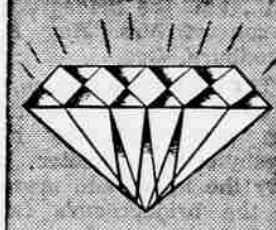
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
