

# Wage Requests Rejected For U.S. Air Traffic Men

Washington — The department of commerce has rejected pleas of the men who control the nation's air traffic for higher wage standards, it was learned Saturday.

The action coincided with mounting congressional concern over air traffic congestion. Two weeks ago a Navy transport collided with a Navy bomber near Los Angeles and 47 persons were killed. Saturday the civil aeronautics board tightened air traffic rules for military fliers.

American Can company's Dixie division will open a three million dollar plant at Lexington, Ky., this year. A Canco official says the firm also will expand its paper facilities in Darlington, S. C., Fort Smith, Ark., and Anaheim, Calif.

New York — City school officials have promised full cooperation to a Senate subcommittee which will hold public hearings here this month on the violence in the city's schools.

approximately 1,500 students are now enrolled. The committee plans to hold public hearings here on Feb. 27 and 28. Staff investigators are expected to interview principals, teachers and other school officials next week preparatory to the hearings.

Superintendent of Schools William Jansen met with committee investigators Friday, and said he had promised to supply them with the information they requested on the extent of delinquency among the city's nearly one million public school pupils and on the operation of the city's special "600" schools for problem youngsters, in which

## Resignation Given By China Premier

Taipei, Formosa — Premier O. K. Yui submitted the resignation of his 17-man cabinet to President Chiang Kai-Shek Saturday after being impeached and reprimanded on charges of waste and corruption.

Chiang received the resignation offer at dawn after a three-hour meeting with Yui. He was not expected to act on the resignation for several weeks.

The control Yuan, watchdog committee of the Nationalist Chinese government, impeached Yui Dec. 23. The judicial Yuan supreme court committee on disciplining public functionaries reprimanded Yui Friday on two of the six counts with which he was charged.
