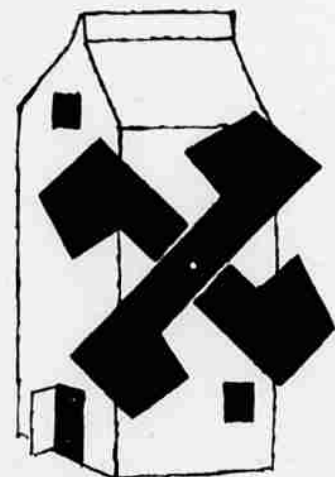


Mount black pieces on pasteboard. Then put them together and make this swan.

How to Make a Windmill Susan Winship

A tall windmill can be made in a few minutes from a square paper milk bottle. Cut two pieces for the arms and sails from stiff paper; use the first as a pattern for the second so they will be alike. Cross them in the middle and hold them together with a piece of sticky tape. Stick a pin or thumbtack through the exact center and fasten to the milk carton. Cut a door and windows in the sides of your windmill.
