Edward A. — We should have a family now.
Myra A.—He resents my career.

Edward A. — I am 32 and my wife is 30. We have been married for six years. Naturally, I want a family, but my wife doesn't seem at all inclined in that direction.

Myra has an interesting job and has had a lot of success at it. Our plan was to save some money during the first three years of our marriage and then to start a family. I am now well able to support a family without Myra's help, but all I can get out of her is "There's time."

I don't think I'm being old-fashioned or bullying when I say that during the childbearing years, at least, a woman's place is in the home. If she isn't willing to accept that place, she shouldn't be married.

Myra A.—For a long time I have had the impression Ed resents my success in my career and that he is all too eager to put me in my "place" as he sees it.

I am now earning more money than Ed. He has long ago stopped congratulating me when I get a raise. If he loved me he would be as proud of me as I am of him when he is successful at something.

It isn't that I don't want a child. I really do, but I firmly believe I can have both a family and a career. Right now I want to establish myself so firmly in my career that I can easily come back after a leave of absence of a few years. I don't think that's being unreasonable or "unwomanly."

In any case, Ed's initial desire for children seems now to have been sidetracked into a desire to put the brakes on Myra's professional ambitions and Myra is fighting back fiercely, overlooking the fact that she is letting the best child-bearing and child-raising years pass her by.

Edward and Myra need to reevaluate their marriage and decide what they really want most. Myra is now riding on a surge of power that grows out of her feeling of accomplishment in her career, but it is likely that deep underneath she feels the lack that Ed is aware of. She should try to understand her own strongest feelings, rather than exhaust her energies in a wasteful battle with her husband.

Oil-Rich Sheiks May Join Union

Amman, Jordan — The oil-rich Persian Gulf sheikdoms of Kuwait and Bahrain may join the new Iraqi-Jordanian Arab Federal Union, informed sources said Saturday.

The two small countries would add greatly to the oil supply controlled by the new union. Saudi Arabia, although standing aloof from actual membership, has given the federation its blessing.

Kuwait is nestled at the southeast corner of Iraq. Bahrain is an island about 200 miles farther southeast in the gulf.

Both have tremendous oil resources but their membership in the federation still would not break the supply line monopoly exercised by the Egyptian-Syrian United Arab Republic.

Most of the present oil pipelines lie across Syria. Egypt controls the cheapest tanker shipping route — the Suez canal.
