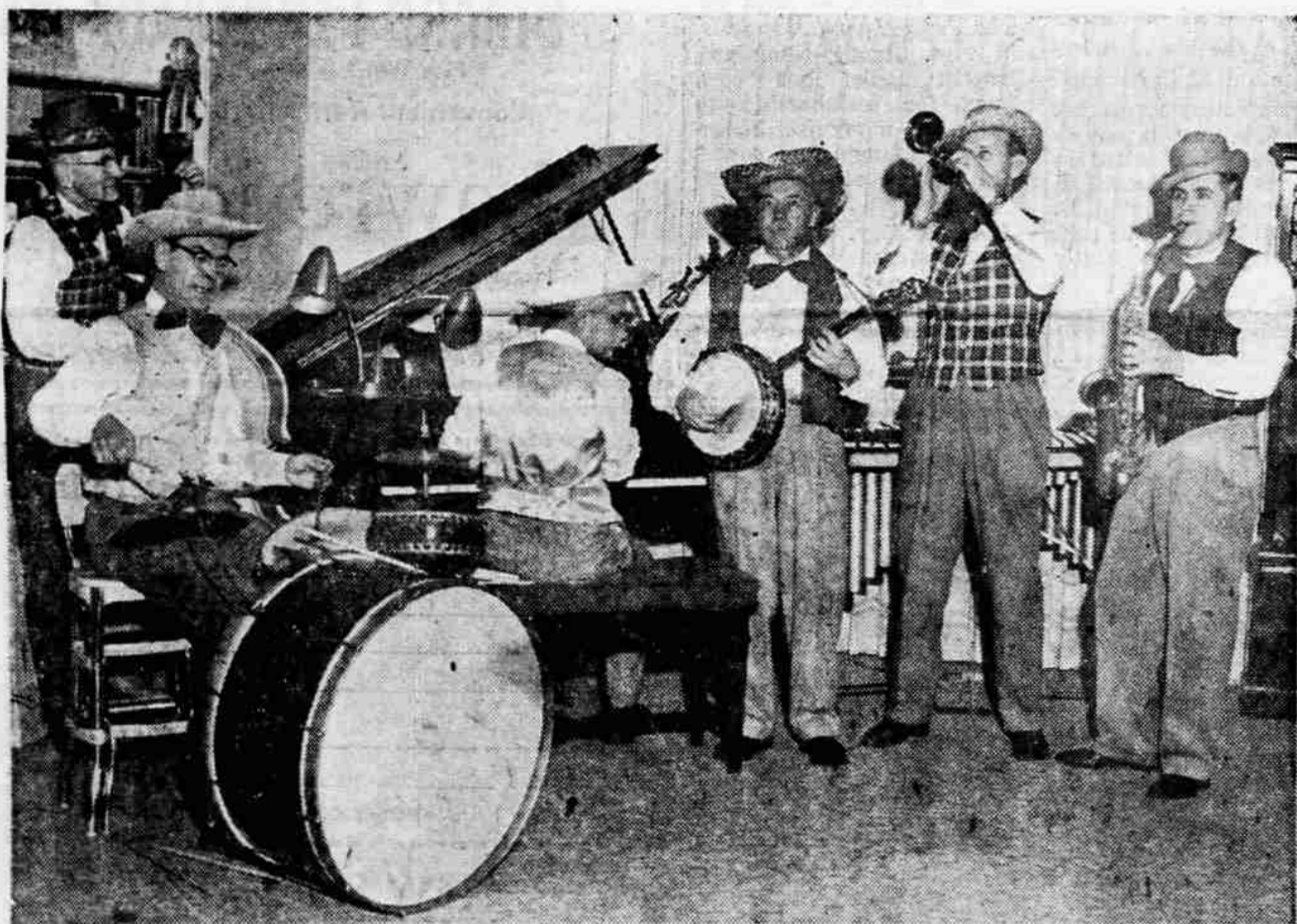
Mrs. David Holmes modeled this silk orange ice chemise dress with black accessories and ropes of beads for the recent annual spring style show of Medford Junior Service league.
