Salem — William M. Langley, Portland, has filed for the Democratic nomination for district attorney of Multnomah county.

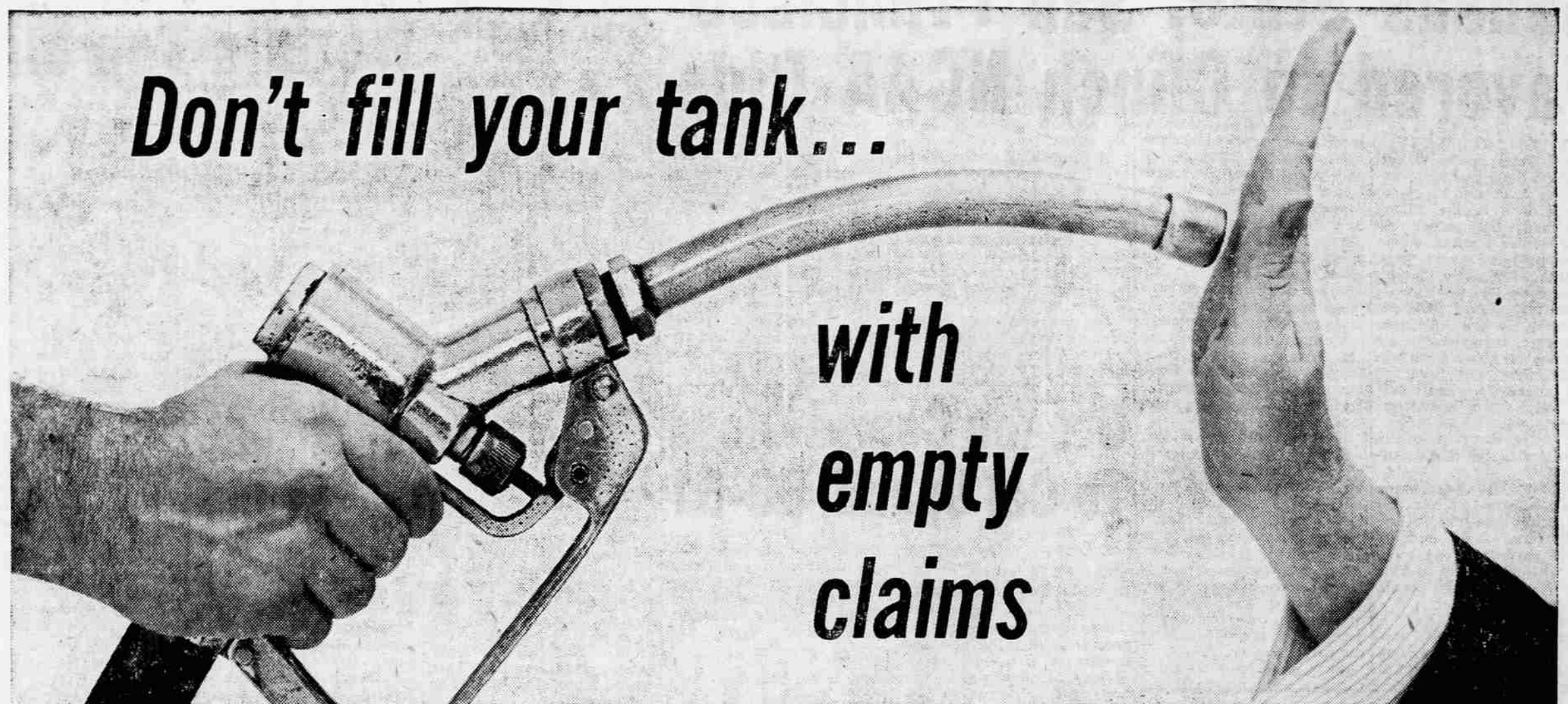
