Judge Medina Reminisces About Trial Of Top Commies on Eve of Retirement

New York—(AP)—Day after tomorrow marks the retirement date for Federal Judge Harold R. Medina, who in a reminiscent mood recently remarked: "What got me through that trial was prayer."
No one needed to ask what he meant by "that trial." It was Judge Medina's first criminal case since President Truman had appointed him to the federal bench a year and half earlier. It began in Jan-

uary, 1949, and ended nine months and 5,000,000 (count 'em) words later.

It propelled the judge into national prominence and 11 top U.S. Communists into the jug.

It was one of the longest and most important criminal trials in American history. And it certainly was one of the oddballs of all trials. As a reporter associated with long sieges of it, I don't mind refreshing your memory.

The defense declared at the start that the trial was a frame-up, motivated by "the great white father in Washington"—H. S. Truman, who, they claimed, deliberately created a climate of opinion against them.

Stalling and Worse
Only 15 days after the trial began, the judge accused the Communist attorneys of concerted stalling. Before it was

over, he accused them of trying to break his health.

Winter turned to spring and spring to summer. The words flowed on. I have a mental picture of the judge sitting there, his sad face (with the Adolphe Menjou mustache) cupped in his hands—heaving a sigh now and then: "I tell you to desist and you keep right on; I warn you now, there is a day of reckoning coming."

Often his brow clouded and his face reddened but his voice kept soft. He almost seemed to wear a halo of commanding initials, NRE—no reversible error. Ordinarily a fun-loving, gregarious man, he turned himself into a hermit, determined the trial would not wear him down. He went out only on week ends, and then only with his wife, to dinner. He saved all his energy for the courtroom.

Nusbaum Speaks At Lions Meeting

W. V. Nusbaum, manager of the Medford office of the Social Security administration, spoke to the Medford Lions club at its regular meeting Tuesday, Feb. 25.

Nusbaum discussed the effect the 1956 amendments to the social security law have had on the old-age and survivors insurance program, both nationally and locally, with particular emphasis on the amendments providing for disability insurance payments, lowering of the age requirement for women to 62, coverage of various professional groups and changes in the status of various farm owners and operators.

He pointed out that during 1957 the Medford office forwarded 1,878 applications for retirement and survivors benefits and 304 applications for disability benefits.

President Louie Ruhl presided and Eston Humphrey was program chairman.

Foreign Press Picks Leading Motion Pictures

Hollywood — (AP)—British actor Alec Guinness and "The Bridge over the River Kwai" took top honors Wednesday night at the Hollywood Foreign Press Association's "Golden Globe" presentations.

The versatile Guinness was named best dramatic actor of the year for his performance in "Bridge," chosen best picture of the year by the press corps.

David Lean received the best director award for his work in the award-winning "Bridge," produced by Sam Spiegel of Horizon Pictures and released through Columbia.

Joanne Woodward was honored as the best dramatic actress of the year for her performance in the Twentieth Century Fox "Three Faces of Eve."

Kay Kendall Chosen
"Les Girls," produced by Sol C. Siegal, was selected as the best musical of the year, and Kay Kendall was chosen to receive the award for the best performance by an actress in a musical for her work in it.

Frank Sinatra walked off with the best performance by an actor in a musical for "Pal Joey."

Awards for the best supporting roles went to Red Buttons, "Sayonara," and Elise Lanchester, "Witness for the Prosecution."

Tony Curtis and Doris Day were selected for "Henrietta" awards, given annually by the press corps to world film favorites as determined by an international poll.

Epps Urges Good Qualifications

Portland—State chairman of the Democratic party, Dave Epps, this week urged county chairmen and vice chairmen take immediate action to insure qualified Democratic candidates for state and county offices.

He further urged prospective candidates to take the initiative in contacting Democratic county chairmen.

"I am disturbed by our failure to make an all out effort in filling the Democratic ticket throughout the state," Epps said. "Nothing we can do for the cause of good government is more important than giving voters first class Democratic candidates."

County chairmen, he claimed, had a responsibility for persuading outstanding Democrats to file. Deadline for filing is March 7.

Moscow — (AP)—Laika, the dog sent into outer space on board Soviet Sputnik II, soon will be enshrined on a matchbox cover. A Russian match factory announced today it will produce covers showing Laika peering into space against a background of swirling comets, planets and stars.

Weights, Measures Week To Be Observed

Salem — Here's one week, weights and measures, that won't get any extra observation in Oregon because the state's inspectors will be too busy making their routine inspections of weights and measures. The first annual national Weights and Measures week has been set from March 2-8.

The state department of agriculture's nine full-time inspectors checked for accuracy 15,041 scales, 13,360 fuel oil meters and 25,620 food packages in 1957. They were assisted by 10 fieldmen who combine weights and measures work with other inspection duties. Department trucks traveled 105,000 miles, making the tests.
