Yemen Will Join Arab Republic

Cairo—Yemenite Crown Prince Seif al-Islam El Badr announced formally today that his country has decided to join the United Arab Republic.

El Badr's announcement, issued shortly after his arrival by air from Yemen, confirmed reports that have circulated here ever since the union of Egypt and Syria was first proclaimed.

The Crown Prince said Yemen's King Prince Ahmed has authorized him to sign an agreement adding the sunken Red Sea state to the union.

The addition of Yemen to the grouping would increase its membership to three states, none of which adjoins any of the others. Israel and Jordan separate Egypt from Syria and Saudi Arabia separates Yemen from Egypt.

London—J. E. S. Simon, financial secretary to the Treasury, was startled Thursday to hear shouts of "Resign! Resign!" when he told Commons it was government policy "to reduce the standard of living." Then he realized what he had said and blushing corrected himself, admitting "I should have said the cost of living."
