Drivers Licenses Suspended Listed

Salem — The department of motor vehicles has released names of 379 whose licenses were ordered suspended during the period beginning March 19 and ending March 25.

Length of suspension varies, depending on charges involved, recommendation of court, discretionary action by the department or requirements of Oregon law. The department said some of the licenses involving financial responsibility and court recommendations may have been reinstated after suspension was ordered.

The department warned drivers that the penalty for driving while suspended is a jail sentence of no less than two days and up to six months, and there may be imposed a fine up to \$500. Under licensing procedures, this will also result in an additional year of suspension.

Pressure Growing For Tax Decision

Washington — President Eisenhower was under growing pressure today to make a decision this month on whether to recommend an anti-recession tax cut.

The pressure came from influential Speaker Sam Rayburn, who will call the signals in the House where any tax-reducing legislation must originate, and from a member of the President's own cabinet, Labor Secretary James P. Mitchell.

Their insistence conflicted with the advice of high administration officials that the President wait until late May, when he will have a fuller picture of economic conditions, before deciding on the tax question.

Robeson Concert at Pittsburgh Cancelled

Pittsburgh — Gilbert Cloonan, superintendent of Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Hall, said Tuesday that baritone Paul Robeson's concert scheduled for April 21 was cancelled because it would not be consistent "with the memorial character of the building."

The 60-year-old singer is making his first appearance in the United States in four years.
