The Medical Roundup

What Is an Allergy?

People ask me to tell all about allergies, but I can not even try. I think some of the textbooks on allergy are three inches thick. I think usually a person must be born to be allergic. Certainly, an asthmatic man or woman is likely to have some near relative who is asthmatic or otherwise highly allergic. Many persons who are born with a tendency to allergy, early in life get highly sensitized to the pollens or ragweed or golden rod, or some trees, and, as a result, every year they suffer from hay fever. Some shade over from hay fever to asthma. Some persons have a hay fever-like disease or an asthma all year, when they get sensitized to some dust or animal emanation or mold to which they are constantly exposed. Others get an asthma-like disease which is due mainly to emphysema (a degenerative disease of the lungs) or to a chronic failure of the heart.

Many sensitive infants suffer from allergic skin rashes, and others suffer from colics and a sore abdomen due to the eating of some food to which they are sensitive, like cow's milk, orange juice, egg or chocolate which they were given in early infancy at a time when they should probably have been on mother's milk.

Once, when I made a special search for allergies in hundreds of my patients, I found one in four was sensitive to cow's milk. I have long suspected that our present-day practice of immediately drying up a woman's breasts and then quickly giving her infant foods suitable for adults is insane, but I do not say much because I haven't the statistics that would prove whether or not our modern practice is working well. A while ago, as I discussed this question with an old doctor who, 50 years ago, had a huge general practice, we agreed that we could not remember in our childhood days or our early days of practice seeing children with severe allergy. Today, such children are numbered by the hundreds thousand. Could our curious ways of feeding infants be in part responsible? I wonder. Certainly, if I were a mother with a new-born infant, I would try very hard to nurse that infant at least for a few months, so as to protect him from getting a number of distressing food allergies.

When Should One Suspect A Brain Tumor

I hate to discuss this question because there are so many over-worried persons who would just love to twist and misinterpret what I say so they can worry themselves into a terrible funk. First, I should say, brain tumors are so rare that I very seldom see a case.

Usually, when a woman comes in almost certain that she has a brain tumor, all I find is an ordinary migraine or sick headache. In most cases, when a woman admits she is worried sick over a brain tumor, I find she has had the same symptoms for seven or eight years, and then I laugh because, as I say, if she had had a tumor growing and expanding in her brain, years ago she would have been forced to have an operation.

Few people realize that one of the common signs of a brain tumor is a marked change in character. For instance, one of the last patients I saw with such a tumor was a minister who had been coming to church late. This worried his deacons, but finally, when he started to baptize a child, using the funeral service, they knew that it was time for him to see a doctor.

The next man who came in with a brain tumor would not take his hat off in my office; he answered my questions with wise-cracks, and when I was out of the room for a few minutes, he urinated on the floor! Hence it is, so long as one does not become too eccentric, he probably need not worry about getting a brain tumor.

People want to know what bronchitis is. It is an inflammation of the bronchi which are the tubes that carry air into and out of the lungs.

There is an acute bronchitis such as goes with influenza or a bad cold, and a chronic bronchitis, such as goes with heavy smoking or asthma. In many cases a severe and acute bronchitis will be associated with a small patch or several small patches of pneumonia, and then we have a bronchopneumonia. Today, fortunately, many of these acute conditions can quickly be relieved with the help of an antibiotic.

Certainly, anyone with a bad morning cough due to heavy smoking ought to cut out his cigarettes. To go on with a bad bronchitis is to run a great risk. Two of my chain-smoking friends each had such a bronchitis. One got caught out one night in a storm and three days later was dead of pneumonia. The other had to have an emergency operation on his stomach, and two days later was dead of pneumonia.

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FIRST IN RUBBER

American Motors Proposal Rejected

Detroit—The United Auto Workers hung an "unacceptable" sign today on an American Motors Corp. proposal to extend its present contract with the auto firm for two years and in some cases even reduce AMC's labor costs.

The UAW also announced it would open bargaining with AMC April 15.

The AMC demands, announced Wednesday at a press conference by Vice President Cushman, were based on the industrial relations Edward L. company's contention its labor costs were still above those of its competitors—both in autos and appliances.

The AMC disclosure marked a "first" in union-management relations in the auto industry. In the past the union has publicized its contract demands in advance of negotiations while the companies have remained silent.
