What happens in Canada is always interesting to us on this side of the border, because we feel we have more in common with the Canadians than with any other people.

The results of Monday's Canadian election are more than usually interesting to us because they may provide a preview of what will happen to us this coming November.

IN Canada, as down here, they have a recession.

In Canada, as on this side, the recession was the BIG political issue. The campaign revolved around WHO IS TO BLAME FOR THE SLUMP—the Liberals, who had been in power for 22 years up to last June, or the Conservatives who came into power then and have been running things since.

Both parties put forth programs to fix things up. The Liberals proposed tax cuts of as much as 400 million dollars aimed at stimulating consumer spending.

The Conservatives, who came to a rather shaky seat of power last June and were seeking to firm up their control, called for a mammoth public works program as the thing needed to turn the trick.

THE voters settled it. They went for the Conservative's program of big public works. They went for it in a big way.

Before Monday's election, the Conservatives had only 113 of the 265 seats in the Canadian house of commons—20 less than a majority. They came out of the Donnellybrook with 208 seats.

The once powerful Liberals came out of it with only 47 seats.

ON this side of the border, as you will probably note, the program of the Eisenhower administration runs more or less in the same direction as the program of the Canadian Liberal party. The Democrats down here are more closely in line with the program of the Canadian Conservatives—that is, government spending in a large way.

The result of the Canadian election will probably confirm the Democrats in their belief that big government spending is the political answer. It will probably shake the confidence in the Eisenhower administration's wait-and-see policy.

Votes, after all, are what it takes to win elections.

A WORD of explanation as to party names is probably in order here. In these modern days, party names mean little or nothing. The modern Canadian Conservative party is far less conservative than the Canadian Liberal party.

The Canadian Liberal party is far less "liberal"—in the sense of being liberal with the taxpayers' money—than the Conservatives.

On the face of it, the Canadian election looks like a turn toward the left in the sense that "leftists" tend generally toward heavy dependence on Big Government.

THAT isn't true.

In Monday's election in Canada, there were four parties—the Liberals and the Conservatives on one side of the fence and the Social Credit party and the Socialist Co-operative Commonwealth federation on the other. The Liberals and the Conservatives are middle-of-the-roads. The other two parties were well over on the leftist side.

The Socialist-leaning parties took a terrible licking. One of them disappeared entirely, losing all its former seats. The other dropped from 26 seats to eight.
