

Churches Schedule Easter Sunrise Services

City and County Groups Included

Sunrise Easter services are being planned by many of the local churches. Several combined community services will be also held with the public invited to attend any of the services.

The sunrise services are listed below and are not included in the church directory listings.

Medford Interchurch Youth Council—The annual service will be held Sunday at Huener's Butte at 6 a.m. near Jacksonville. Approximately 12 churches have indicated that they will participate.

The service will begin with a bugle salute to the dawn played by Dave Frohnmayer, Bob Sheldon, and Ted Lawson, all from the First Presbyterian church, Medford. Miss Joan Laurila, First Methodist church, will be worship leader.

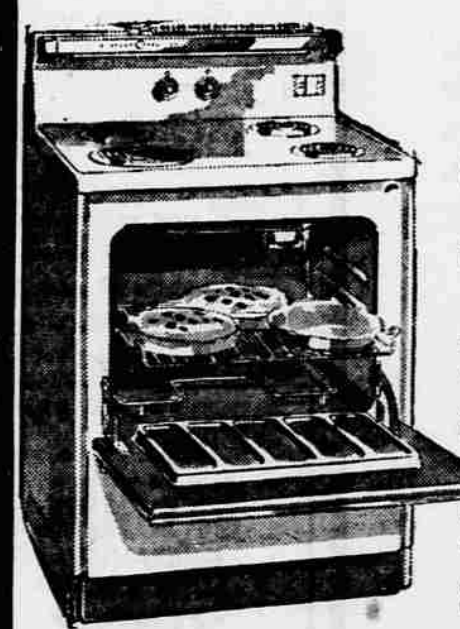
