# Sen. Byrd Virtually Assured Reelection

Richmond, Va. — Sen. Harry F. Byrd (D-Va.) won the state Democratic nomination by default Thursday and was virtually assured of reelection to the fifth six-year term.

Thomas H. Blanton, chairman of the Democratic State Central committee, issued a statement late in the day declaring Byrd to be the only candidate who had "complied with the Democratic Party plan and the Virginia election laws."

Byrd, 69, who announced last Feb. 12 that he would not run again. Less than two weeks later he reversed that decision.

# Okinawans Killed In Munitions Blast

Naha, Okinawa — Thirty-two Okinawan scrap collectors were feared to have been killed in a munitions explosion off North Kadena Thursday.

The blast is believed to have occurred on the U.S. vessel Canada Victory, sunk since the Okinawa battle and lying a mile off the coast of Toyaku village.

North Kadena Air Base witnesses reported seeing four canoes around the area shortly before an earthshaking explosion, then a water column and white smoke soaring upward.

Thirty-two persons were confirmed as missing. A similar incident killed 30 divers retrieving metal from a sunken hulk of an LST in the same area last July.
