The Mental Health Campaign Beginning April 27, the National Association for Mental Health (10 Columbus Circle, N.Y. 19, N.Y.) is putting on an important campaign for funds to aid in their work to help the mentally disturbed, and to aid research in psychiatry.

Dr. Alvarez Their slogan is that "With Your Help the Mentally Ill Can Come Back."

Today, wonderfully hopeful things are happening in the field of psychiatry. Instead of the old type of armchair theorizer, who just kept quoting Freud and more Freud, today we have many able scientific psychiatrists who are going into laboratories; they are finding new drugs that help the insane to recover. They are making it possible for mentally disturbed people to be cared for in hospitals in which the doors are not locked.

I was just reading of several British mental hospitals in which nearly all of the doors are unlocked, and in which, as a result, the patients are a much happier. Strangely, the superintendents say that no greater percentage of the patients abscond than formerly did when the doors were locked.

I do not know of any better use for money than in the helping of the mentally confused. As I say in another column, today in a well-run mental hospital, as many as 80 per cent of the patients who enter can be sent home in from three to six months. The earlier these patients be-

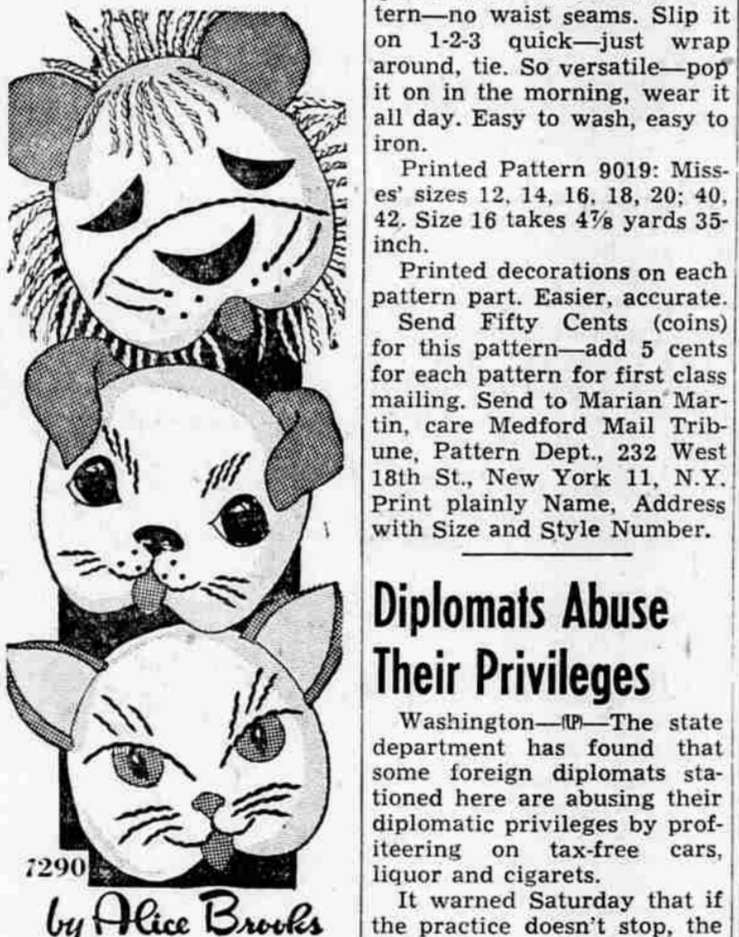

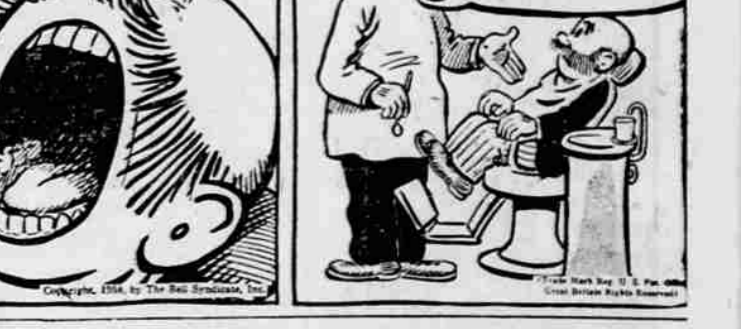
