More on a Stomach Ulcer

Many persons ask, "What is the cause of a stomach or duodenal or peptic ulcer?"

The greatest danger to a patient whose ulcer is apparently healed comes when he runs into some great distress.

I often tell a patient that when a great worry has come he shouldn't wait for the ulcer to flare-up and cause a hemorrhage or a perforation; he should start immediately to take his milk every two hours, and then he must keep it up for most of the night.

To show what I mean, one day a big handsome man came in with the story that recently he had had a big hemorrhage because of the flare-up of an ulcer that had been quiet for years. When I asked him what terrible thing had happened to him the day before, tears came to his eyes, and he said, "Doctor, just think; that day I discovered, after having the books audited, that my partner, who had been my buddy in the First World War, and later my brother-in-law, had for years been stealing large sums from me. I didn't sleep much that night; I was all shot to pieces nervously, and next day, up came the blood."

If I had seen that man the day before, I would have had him start right away taking milk every hour or two. This would have served to neutralize the acid in his stomach, and it might well have saved him from tearing open his old ulcer scar.

How about surgery? In cases of duodenal ulcer, I never have the patient operated on unless it becomes clear that even with a simple life he has severe pain every night—pain which keeps him awake and pulls him down. I always have an operation per-

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formed if I feel satisfied that the ulcer has perforated posteriorly to produce a sort of abscess. In cases of ulcer of the stomach, not duodenal, I generally have an operation performed right away, because I cannot be sure that the patient hasn't already a cancerous ulcer. I do not like operations for a duodenal ulcer because, too often, the patient later gets another ulcer, which sometimes is more painful and more dangerous than the one he had to begin with. I practically never order an operation for ulcer on a woman because I cannot remember a woman who did really well after such a procedure. Because of some sad experiences, I dread the operation of vagotomy (cutting the big nerves to the stomach). I think it significant that none of the scores of physicians I know who have a duodenal ulcer have ever let themselves be operated on for their trouble!
