

Cow Palace Jammed For Billy Graham's Religious Crusade

San Francisco—Billy Graham had sin on the run today. The evangelist was frankly astonished at the Sunday afternoon crowd that turned out for the opening of his six-week crusade at the San Francisco Cow Palace. There were 18,000 jammed into the cavernous building and another 5,000 milling on the parking lot outside. Traffic was jammed for six miles around the building. "This took us all by surprise," Graham said. "We didn't expect anything like this. I had to show my credentials to three different policemen to get in!" It was the largest opening day audience Graham has had in 13 years of evangelism. Graham had to give two sermons—one to those inside and another to those outside. The crowd, he said, "is indicative of the spiritual hunger of our day." Explaining the aims of his crusade, Graham said sternly: "We have not come here to put on a show. We have not come here to entertain you. We have come here to open this book, the Holy Bible...night after night, we are going to open these pages and see what the Bible says." Search for Peace

After citing the evils of present-day life, Graham threw his arms aloft in a sweeping gesture and cried: "Is there some place I can find peace? If you live out here in California, and have a home and a family, you ought to be happy, but you're not. You're out of balance that's what's wrong. "This thing deep down inside you that is searching for something is your soul. You can't satisfy your soul by getting drunk. You can't satisfy your soul by a sex experience. "Sin—that's your trouble. That's my trouble. We are sinners! Every person in this audience has broken the ten commandments." As his oratory warmed during the hour-long sermon, Graham gestured violently, often with a quivering Bible in his left hand.

During his sermon, Graham touched on the troubles of movie star Lana Turner. "Something is wrong when we see a beautiful woman weeping because her daughter killed a man," he said. And of the wealthy resort city of Palm Springs, Calif., where he acquired a deep sun tan before arriving here, Graham said he found "more misery per square inch" there than anywhere he has been. After the sermon, 380 persons moved forward to make a "decision for Christ." Counselors took them to a side room for interviews. As they came forward, Graham asked: "When have we ever had a moment like this in the Bay Area? It may never come again."

Indonesia Head Narrowly Escapes Capture By Rebels

Singapore—The Indonesian loyalists said rebel Premier Sjafruddin narrowly escaped capture Wednesday by government troops mopping up rebel resistance in Central Sumatra. Lt. Col. Rudy Pirngadie, the loyalist military spokesman, said Sjafruddin "barely escaped with his life" when he drove into the town of Alahanpandjang, 18 miles southeast of the rebel army's headquarters at Solok, the day after it had fallen to the loyalists. Pirngadie said also that the loyalists captured Solok and a number of lesser communities Thursday, leaving only two major Sumatran centers in rebel hands. He said the loyalists inflicted 27 casualties—5 killed, 3 wounded and 19 captured—on the rebels in the two days' fighting, including 3 killed, 3 wounded and 3 captured among the party that accompanied Sjafruddin into Alahanpandjang. On Celebes Island, 1,500 miles east of Sumatra, the loyalists "cleaned out nests of rebel resistance" in the Kawai area, capturing "large amounts of weapons and equipment," Pirngadie said.

Medford To Host Carpenters in 1959 Astoria—The Oregon State Council of Carpenters, AFL-CIO, ended its 33rd annual convention in Astoria Saturday after electing Swan Nelson of Portland as president of the group. Nelson defeated E. B. Weber, 59 to 57. Weber had headed the council for 10 years. The council, in its closing session, adopted a resolution favoring immediate activation of federal "make work" program in Oregon designed to spur the economy out of the recession. Earl Hartley, western council executive secretary of the Lumber and Sawmill Workers Union, urged the delegates to support his union's fight to restrict Japanese plywood imports. He complained the Japanese workers produce quality plywood and get only 11 cents per hour. Medford was selected as next year's convention city.

Gov. Knight O.K.s Pay Adjustment Pasadena, Calif.—Gov. Goodwin J. Knight issued his approval of proposed legislation calling for an adjustment of salaries for federal employees comparable to pay received by workers in private enterprise who perform similar duties. The governor told members of the State Federation of Federal employees he believed such salary adjustments would promote economy in government "by increasing efficiency and reducing turnover."

"The Federal government cannot afford to lag behind other employers in the matter of compensating its employees," he said "for this can only result in recruitment problems and decreased efficiency of the service." All Vice Presidents In Television Office

Hollywood—TV Producer John Guedel has no personnel problems in his office, and he attributes this to the fact that the 100 persons in his company are all vice presidents, including him. "No one is president," said Guedel, whose radio-TV shows have been in orbit nationally for up to 20 years. "Everyone receives business cards with his name, title of vice president and then our name, address and phone number."

"You'd be surprised how happy this makes people. When a 19-year-old switchboard operator goes into a department store, for example, to open a charge account and presents her business card, there's a little surprise. Then someone from the store phones and finds that she is a vice president of John Guedel Productions. The girl feels good and is happy about working for us."

Guedel, whose shows include "People Are Funny," (20 years), "House Party," (14 years) and "You Bet Your Life" (12 years), said the title applies equally to clerks, script girls, writers, executives and others. "We tried to have an office manager once, but no one wanted to be known as that," he said. Guedel said there's no personnel turnover to speak of. He said no one quits, and everyone's soft with the result that there's been only one firing. Known as Working Producer

He is known as a working producer rather than an executive producer whose actual on-stage chores would be handled by regular producers. This means he's mighty busy, since there are 260 House Party shows yearly. 30 People are Funny programs and 39 Groucho Marx You Bet Your Life shows. He thinks of his shows as a mixture of variety and audience participation. The kids on House Party are never a source of worry despite their candor, he said; it's what the adults say—often about their neighbors—that scares him. Guedel, 43, who admits originating the singing commercial (1937) but isn't sure

now just how he feels about what he started, is known as the most successful producer of "package" TV shows. One of his precepts is that all his shows can be simulcast—that is, on radio and TV at the same time. "We did once offer someone the job of president," he

said. "I read about former President Herbert Hoover and his economy in government studies a couple of years ago. I thought we could always save money, so I wrote him and offered him the job. He answered that he wouldn't want a job unless he could make a definite contribution to it."

"Well, I wrote back, telling him that we often had elephants on our shows, and, after all, he as a Republican should know about them and, well, anyhow, he didn't answer that one. And that's why we're still all vice presidents."
