Thousands Of Anglers Try Lakes

Many trout were caught, both Saturday and Sunday at Fish lake as the angling season opened but the fishing was not so good as on the opening days last year, the report management reported today.

Cold water and cold weather, it was felt kept angling from being better although some limits of 30 trout were caught. Largest fish measured among those taken at Fish lake was 21 inches long. Total fishermen on Sunday were estimated at 1,500 after a lesser number on Saturday.

Lots of Limits
At Willow lake fishing was good Saturday morning with lots of limits of 10 taken. Angling slowed in the afternoon, was still slow Sunday morning but picked up again yesterday afternoon. An estimated 5,000 fishermen Saturday and 3,000 Sunday were on hand. Bank fishing was good Saturday morning. A good number of 18 to 19 inch trout were caught at Willow.

Fishing for both lakes for the week end was summarized as better than fair.

Portland—Oreg.—Oregon anglers by the tens of thousands flocked out for opening day of the trout season Saturday and reported generally good success.

More than 8,000 persons were at Detroit reservoir southeast of Salem with many limits reported.

Central Oregon streams were good producers and limits also were reported from Lake Simstutus behind Pelton dam. Some smaller streams in western Oregon also were good producers and limits were taken in the McKenzie despite high water. Devils lake was only fair while Sitkoos lake was good.

Podres Records Third Victory Of Season For Dodgers; Cubs Pull Triple Play Against SF

Johnny Podres, off to the fastest start of his career, may finally be headed for the 20-victory campaign that's always eluded him.

Brooklyn's 1955 World Series hero turned in his third straight victory of the season Sunday when he pitched the Los Angeles Dodgers to a 10-3 win over the stumbling St. Louis Cardinals. He's yielded only six runs and struck out 19 batters while compiling a 1.87 earned run average.

Podres always has been regarded as one of the game's top pitchers when he's in shape but recurring back and arm ailments have prevented him from having a really big year. Even last season when his 2.66 E.R.A. was the best in the National League he had only a 12-9 win-loss record.

Johnny, 25, scattered 10 hits on Sunday and struck out five batters. He's scored three of Los Angeles' five victories and is the only Dodger pitcher to go the distance.

Games Rained Out
Podres' performance was the highlight of a rainy day. Six of 11 scheduled games were postponed. The Chicago Cubs pulled the season's first triple play enroute to a 5-4 win over the San Francisco Giants and the Philadelphia Phillies beat the Milwaukee Braves, 6-2, in other National League games while the Detroit Tigers whipped the Cleveland Indians, 9-5 and the Boston Red Sox topped the

Washington Senators, 7-5, in AL games.
