Board of Health Warns Of Poison in Mussels

Salem—The state board of health today issued a warning against consumption of marine mussels or uncleaned clams taken from Oregon coastal waters.

Dr. Harold M. Erickson, state health officer, said a ban on sale and distribution of the seafood between May 1 and Oct. 31 each year was continued throughout the past winter because of an off-season invasion into northwest coastal waters of a tiny poison-producing plankton called G. catenella.

Periodic laboratory tests were made throughout the winter months to guarantee

the safety of any Oregon seafood entering the open market, he said.

"It is unsafe to eat any portion of the mussels this time of year because they may contain a strong alkaloid poison similar to strychnine," Dr. Erickson said. He pointed out that digestive organs of clams also may contain the poison, although the white meat is "safe and delicious during this season."

The poison results from the mussels or clams feeding on G. catenella occasionally washed in by the ocean, usually during summer months. These organisms cause the "red tides" sometimes noticed along the west coast.

"Reputable commercial packers are aware of the danger and do not permit any of the harmful seafood to enter the open market," according to the health officer.

Individuals digging clams during the danger period were urged to remove all black portions before eating. White meat and muscular tissues of the clams do not contain the poison.

Dr. Erickson emphasized that the black portions should be destroyed completely and should never be fed to animals or domestic fowl, which are also susceptible to the poison.

Report of Earnings Said Necessary

Persons receiving social security benefits were reminded today that they should notify the Social Security administration district office as soon as possible if they expect their earnings to exceed \$1,200 this year.

W. V. Nusbaum, manager of the Medford office, said that frequently no report is made until the \$1,200 mark is reached, and then, as a result of further earnings, some of the payments already received have to be returned.

Earnings of more than \$1,200 a year by anyone under age 72 receiving social security benefits may cause one or more months benefits to be withheld, Nusbaum pointed out that by prompt notice being given the social security district office as soon as it is known that earnings will exceed \$1,200 a year, the necessity for repayment of benefits already received can usually be avoided.

Social security beneficiaries are given a form at the time they apply for benefits which can be used to report earnings, or the report can be made by writing, telephoning or visiting the Medford social security office, at 33 North Riverside ave.

Bomber-Missile Due Air Force

Washington—The Air Force will begin to receive delivery this year of a deadly new bomber-missile combination described officially as "our answer to the defenses around Moscow," it was disclosed Thursday.

The bomber is a long range version of the 650-mile an hour B52 which has been designated B52G. In announcing that delivery will start this year, the Boeing Airplane Co. said that the plane could fly more than 12,000 miles with only one in-flight refueling.

The missile which the new airplane will carry is the Hound Dog, described as a "super elusive miniature supersonic airplane" and built by North American Inc.

The B52G will be able to launch Hound Dog Missiles while flying several hundred miles from its target.
