Easement Sought at City Airport for Approach Lights

Medford City Manager Robert Duff was authorized by the council last night to negotiate for an easement or to purchase a section of property north of the main runway at the municipal airport.

The land is necessary for installation of an approach light system, Duff said. The system will extend about 3,000 feet along the centerline of the main runway, and about 200 feet of the system will be on property now owned by the city.

A lease of the brick building at the airport, which was formerly used by the Air Force, to the Civil Aeronautics Administration was approved. Under the agreement, the city will restore the building at a cost of \$1,625 of which the government's share would be \$750. The cost would be repaid to the city over a 12-month period as an increased rental charge.

Segregation of several assessments in the Woodlawn sanitary sewer district was approved. The changes were necessary because sections of property in the area were sold.

Authorization for installation of stop signs at the 10th st. intersections of Riverside and Central ave. was approved. A report of the spur railroad track on East Second st. was deferred until the May 15 council meeting.

Duff was authorized to discuss with the state highway commission the construction plan of the Fourth, Fifth and Jackson st. intersections along the proposed Highway 99 freeway. He told the council he believed the state would assume some of the cost for the project.

Duff was authorized to file an application for a federal government grant to share the cost of construction of the Grandview-Kenwood sewage treatment works.

State Aviation Board, Air Patrol Continue Battle

Portland — Words continued to fly today in the verbal battle between the Civil Air Patrol and the Oregon Bureau of Aeronautics as an aftermath to last week's rescue of Mrs. Patricia Davis of Fresno, Calif., in central Oregon.

Col. Howard Freeman of San Francisco, western regional commander of the CAP, held a press conference here Thursday afternoon in which he defended CAP search practices and criticized the Aeronautics Bureau. The dispute was brought into the open earlier when Earl Snyder, director of the Aeronautics bureau charged the CAP had hindered last week's search operation.

Failure Noted
Col. Freeman, a public relations man in private life, charged that the state bureau had failed in the past to make maximum search efforts by calling in the CAP. He said that CAP has been called into some 60 searches in California whereas in Oregon it has been asked to take part by the state only once in two years. He said the CAP had taken part in 10 searches in Oregon in the past eight months but that it had to call the state and ask to be included in the hunt.

Col. Freeman said Oregon and Idaho were the only states where the CAP had a problem in getting along with the State Bureau of Aeronautics.

He said he could find no substances for Snyder's charges.

The Air Force will conduct a hearing into charges and countercharges May 12.

O&C Timber Sale

Checks Mailed Counties

Washington — Interior Secretary Fred A. Seaton today announced the mailing of checks totalling \$300,000 to 18 western Oregon counties. The money represented the final payments of the counties' share of timber sale receipts from the controversial lands of the O and C railroad grants.

The funds had been held in a special trust fund pending settlement of civil court action. Douglas county receives the largest amount of \$68,076.

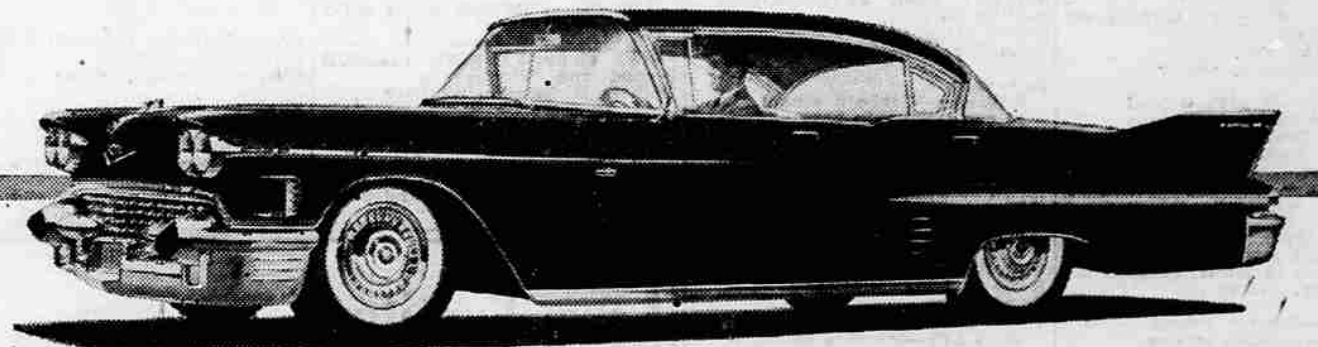
