

Dulles in Berlin For Brief Meeting

Berlin — Secretary of State John Foster Dulles arrived today from Copenhagen for a 3½ hour visit sandwiched between the NATO meeting and a conference in Paris of American ambassadors in Europe.

"The people of free Berlin have won the respect of the American people for the determination they have repeatedly demonstrated to defend their freedom," Dulles said on arrival.

"We have shared your satisfaction in the progress made in the face of constant difficulties toward reconstructing your city and solving your economic problems."

Dulles, who flew here with Llewellyn Thompson, ambassador to Moscow, was greeted by the Berlin Lord Mayor, U.S. Ambassador David Bruce, and Maj. Gen. Barksdale Hemlett, Berlin commander.

Curfew on Youths Set To Curb Gang Fights

Back Stairs: Ike's Reading Habits

Washington — Back stairs at the White House:

A reporter recently asked President Eisenhower what he was doing in the way of following his own anti-recession advice to the American people — "buy . . . anything but selectively." The President curtly referred the reporter to his military aide, Col. Robert L. Schulz. The colonel has been unavailable for amplification. However, there have been no signs that any recent purchases for the president have been unusual or large.

Two things purchased regularly for the President by Schulz are paper-back western novels and art supplies.

Simple as it may appear at first glance, Schulz' job of finding western paper-backs for the President has turned out to be a difficult one. His biggest problem is finding a western that the President hasn't already read. Publishers voluntarily keep the president supplied with most of the new ones as they come off the press.

And the President reads them at a fast clip. He reads them often in bed for relaxation before going to sleep. An aide said Eisenhower finds them excellent for relieving the mental tensions built up during the day's work on world and domestic problems.

The first 10 pages usually are enough for the President to decide whether to throw aside a western novel or finish reading it, an aide said. Sometimes, he gets about half through a western in one

reading. Other times, he is ready for sleep after three or four pages.

The President uses his hobby of painting as another means of relaxing and letting

down from the tensions of his office. He usually gets in three or four painting sessions a week. His favored time is for 30 minutes or so after a post-luncheon nap or rest.

Woman Who Named Crosby as Father Offered TV Contract

Hollywood — Attractive Marilyn Scott, 25-year-old telephone operator who named newlywed Dennis Crosby as the father of her six-month-old daughter, entertained renewed hopes today of becoming an actress.

The tall, dark-haired divorcee disclosed Wednesday she had been offered a contract by a television studio and hoped to be able to accept it.

At the same time, she expressed regrets over disclosure of the parentage of her daughter, Michelle Denise Scott. She claims the girl was fathered by young Crosby after a brief romance in January and February of last year.

"I'm sorry all this had to come out," she said. "Particularly because of the effect it might have on my baby's future."

According to birth records, Michelle was born Nov. 24, 1957, at Cedars of Lebanon hospital. The father was listed as Dennis Michael Crosby, a UCLA student.

Mrs. Scott said she was receiving support from the Crosbys but added she needed to go to work. She lives in a \$75-a-month apartment with her daughter.

In Dayton, Ohio, Mrs. Scott's mother said she didn't know "anything about the baby being illegitimate."

"I'm all tore up," she said. Mrs. Marie Schultz, 45, said her daughter moved to Hollywood six years ago.

Dennis was in Las Vegas, Nev., with his bride, showgirl Pat Sheehan, 26-year-old mother of a 6-year-old son. The couple was living in her apartment.

Dennis and statuesque Miss Sheehan, a dancer at the Tropicana Hotel in Las Vegas, were wed on the spur of the moment Sunday night at the Gretna Green wedding chapel.

Next day they found out they had been married by a Protestant minister, the Rev. James Herndon, instead of a justice of the peace as they thought. They issued a joint statement announcing their "regrets" over the "mistake."

Dick Grey Reelected To Pear Committee

Tillamook — Ben East-er, 50, Portland, died in a local hospital Wednesday from injuries suffered in a logging accident Monday.

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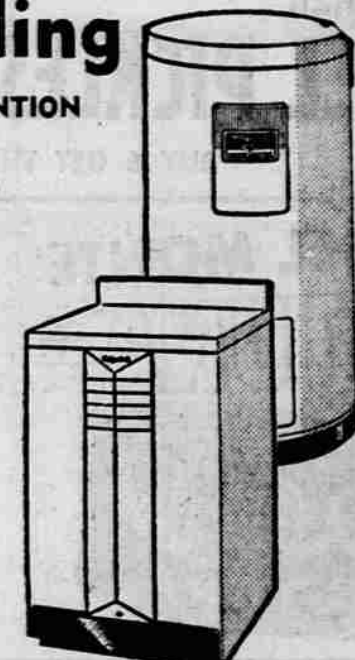
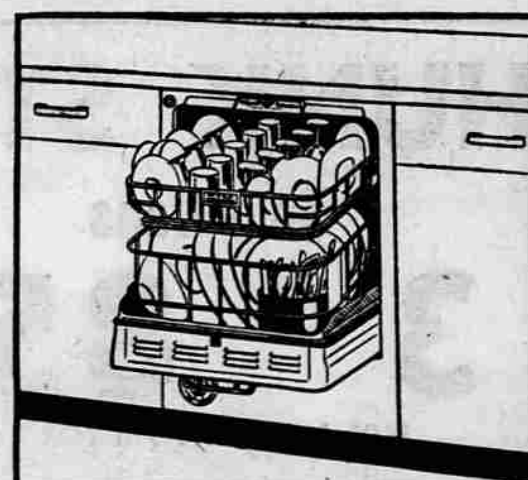
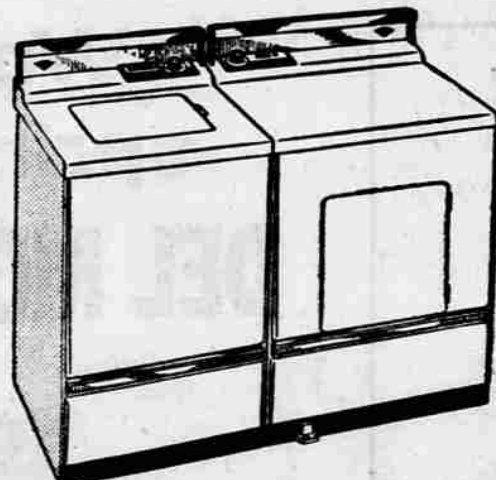
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
