

125 Complaints Received By Local Sheriff's Office

The Jackson county sheriff's office, criminal department, received 125 complaints during April and closed 60, according to Chief Criminal Deputy Joe Walsh.

Sixty complaints are pending of those reported last month. Three complaints were unfounded.

Of the total, 46 complaints were for felonies, 20 for misdemeanors and 59 involved miscellaneous subjects. Seventeen warrants were issued and served this month.

Fifty-three arrests were made and those arrested were held in the county jail. Of the total local arrests, sheriff's officers and state police each made 19 and the Medford police department made six.

38 Involve Males

Of the arrests made, 38 involved males, five females and 10 juveniles. They also involved 18 felonies, 32 misdemeanors, one mental case and two runaways.

The 162 complaints in April of this year compares to 118 in April, 1957, an increase of 44. In April, 1956, 124 complaints were received and 113 in April, 1955.

Of the felony complaints received, 14 involved larceny, 12 for obtaining money under false pretenses, seven for burglary, four for attempted auto thefts, two involving issuance of checks without sufficient funds, two for non-support, one rape case and one robbery, one fugitive from justice and two absent without leave.

A total of 208 civil papers were served, Walsh said.

Journal Reporter Gives Testimony

Portland — Rolla J. Crick, a reporter for the Oregon Journal, testified in a deposition here Friday that former district attorney William Langley had one purpose in mind and Journal reporters another when Langley obtained a search warrant for a raid at the home of Raymond Clark.

Crick testified in connection with a \$200,000 libel suit Langley has filed against the Oregonian.

He said he and another reporter, Brad Williams, were interested in getting copies of tape recordings on which the Oregonian had based its vice and crime series in 1956. He said Langley wanted to obtain copies of obscene material which a phone call to Police Chief Ellsworth Herder of St. Helens indicated might be in Clark's possession.

The raid on the Clark residence was subsequently ruled an illegal search and seizure.

FHA Gives April As High Month

Portland — Oscar Pederson, state director of the Federal Housing authority, said Friday that April was the second highest month in the history of FHA applications.

The total of new and existing units in home mortgage applications was 79,471, surpassed only by a record 89,764 set in May, 1950, Pederson said.

A new all-time record was set by 47,860 existing home applications and 31,610 applications for new homes was the highest number since April of 1955.

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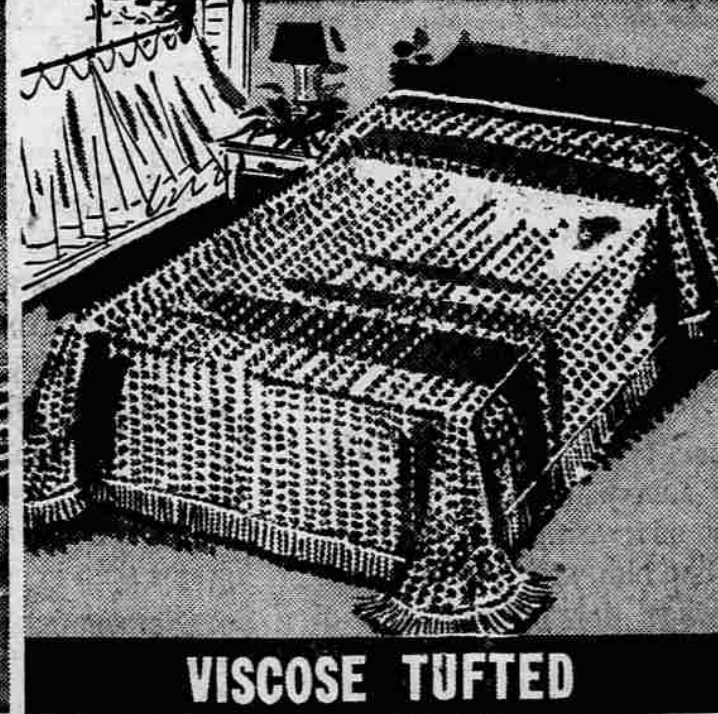


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
