Buried Treasure by Pinkney Gage

Currier-Ives Washington Print Hit by Prohibition

There are apparently over 100 Currier & Ives prints that feature President Washington in one way or another, and among the more valuable is one that shows him with two other generals.

The print is a rather freakish one that was put out to sell as a novelty about the time of the Civil War or a little later. It is undated.

The entire piece, about 10 by 15 inches, is mounted in a special frame so constructed that the other two generals can be seen only by looking from a special angle.

The picture of Washington is in the center. On the right is one of General Scott of Mexican War fame. General McClellan, for whom the saddle is named, is on the left.

The visual effect with the Scott and McClellan pictures was obtained by pasting them back to back, then dividing them in equal lengths and mounting them at right angles to the Washington picture.

It is the sort of art work that is right in keeping with the anti-macassar and bead curtain.

I saw one sold recently with another Currier & Ives Washington print.

The other, dated 1876, was entitled "Washington's Farewell to the Officers of his Army at the Old Tavern, corner of Broad & Pearl sts. Dec. 4, 1783." It differed from other issues of the picture the firm put out by what it showed of the rising influence of the Prohibition Movement in America.

In earlier issues, a wine glass and decanter were in the print. In this one they had been edited out.

Nonetheless, aside from that the picture of Washington's farewell to his officers was vastly more interesting than the novelty item mentioned above.

Not so to collectors, however. The picture of the three generals in the trick frame went for \$180, which is more than \$40 or \$50 higher than it usually brings.

The one of Washington's farewell brought \$40, about half as much as it ought to have sold for.

On buying and selling coins, the thing that is more important to go by than the prices in any of the catalogues is the actual rarity of the piece itself.

For many coins, of course, that is a point impossible to determine, but for some it is easy to do, and one of these is the 1875 quarter eagle that was minted in San Francisco.

Back in 1875, the Philadelphia mint, which has no mint mark, turned out 11,600 of the \$2.50 gold pieces. In San Francisco, however, the mint which stamps its coins with a tiny S, coined only 420 of them.

That is what the Treasury records say, and they can easily be found by consulting almost any of the coin catalogues put out by private dealers.

Naturally enough, with such a small quantity of quarter eagles minted in San Francisco, the price of one is considerably more than that of a Philadelphia issue of the same date and condition. One of the better catalogues shows it to be worth from \$100 to \$165 as against

only \$15 to \$20 for the other. But actually, anyone who owns one of these rare 1875 quarter eagles would be ill advised to sell it at such a low price if it is in good condition.

It obviously costs a collector a lot less to collect quarter eagles than it does \$20 gold pieces or double eagles. Consequently there are a good many more collectors of the smaller coin.

In fact, there are a lot more than 420 of them throughout the world, and since inevitably there are considerably fewer than 420 of these coins, to say nothing of the still smaller number that would still be in good condition, it is evident that one should be able to get even more than the catalogue price.

As the years go by the number of these 420 coins that still exist will shrink still further. At the same time, the number of coin collectors is increasing at a disproportionate rate.

Such a two-way stretch can mean only one thing to the value of the coin—a steady rise in price.

ANY FRANCES PARKMAN FIRST EDITIONS WORTH COLLECTING

Any of the books of Francis Parkman, the professor of horticulture who became a great historian, are worth collecting in their first editions, but one of the more valuable of his books is his first.

It is "The California and Oregon Trail," first published in New York in 1849. The book is not one of the series that made him famous as a historian. Those deal with the struggle between England and France for control of North America. Instead, it is a record of his experiences and travels in the West, undertaken while still a young man.

So far as I know, there is no way of telling whether the two-volume issue of the 1849 work came out ahead of that published in a single volume and bearing the same date. I have seen only the single volume issue.

It is bound in cloth—the one I saw was in blue cloth—and it should have five pages of advertising in it, four in the back and one in the front, before the frontispiece. The two-volume issue is supposed to have appeared in printed wrappers instead of a cloth binding.

Most Teen-Agers Favor Curfew

Chicago—(AP)—A Chicago Youth Commission poll of 500 teenagers showed 83 per cent favored the curfew here because it protected them after dark.

Most of those polled said the 10:30 p.m. weekday curfew did not cut into their leisure time activities, according to the commission. The week end curfew is 11:30 p.m.

Those who opposed the curfew said troublemakers would be out anyway.

Neighborhood groups were a stronger influence than families on more than half of the polled teenagers. But more than two-thirds said adults and parents should get together with teenagers to help solve present problems.

However, the same number of boys and girls said adults generally exaggerate youth problems.

In answer to the question of what they expected from adults, most of those polled said adults should first show concern and respect for others. They also said they expect adults to practice what they preach.

Present public and private agencies are failing to fulfill the needs of youth, according to two-thirds of the young people.

Most resented by the youths are employment limitations based on age, curfew regulations on older youths, restrictions on teenage driving and necessity of paying adults admission and transportation fares.
