

Council on Aging Asks Assistance in Survey

Eugene—The Oregon Council on Aging has asked residents between 35 and 65 years old to participate in a statewide survey of those people who were rejected jobs because they were told they were too old.

Dr. Wesley G. Nicholson, chairman of the committee, said only those residents who have been refused work because of their age should take part in the survey.

Postcards with the person's name, age, address and the type of occupation or business that refused the person a job because of age and when should be sent to Oregon State Council on Aging, post office box 5197, Eugene.

Council Informed
Dr. Nicholson pointed out that the Council has been informed that many persons between 35 and 65 have been turned down for jobs because of their age, but the Council has no funds to conduct a state survey. If enough persons have been turned down, then the problem needs to be studied by the group, he noted.

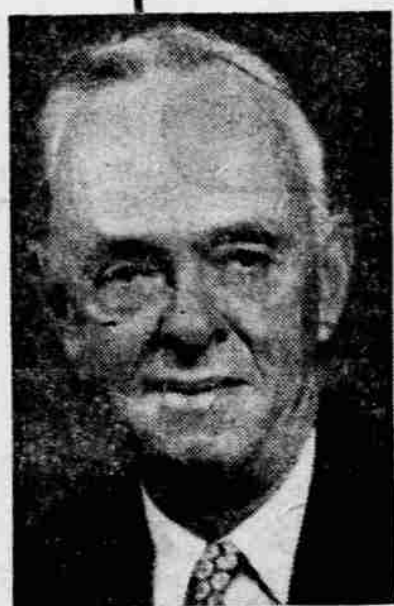

Chavez' Opponent Concedes Defeat

Santa Fe, N.M. — Denis Chavez, in his 24th year as senator from New Mexico, passed the first hurdle in his bid for reelection when his opponent conceded defeat in the Democratic primary shortly before midnight Tuesday.

Chavez, 70, polled 57,686 votes to 31,177 for his opponent, E. S. Walker, former state land commissioner. The votes were from 684 of the 930 voting places.

Pflimin Orders Algerian Leader To Restore Order

Paris — Premier Pierre Pflimin today ordered Gen. Raoul Salan, French commander in Algeria, to take charge of insurrection-ridden Algiers and restore order.

The move followed shortly after President Rene Coty demanded loyalty from the 400,000 French troops in Algeria where a military-civilian junta seized power with a "committee of public safety" and urged Gen. Charles de Gaulle to head up a new strong man government in Paris. New disorders appeared to be shaping up in the wake of riots in Paris and Algiers Tuesday.

Prohibit Demonstrations

Pflimin and his Cabinet also decided today to prohibit all public demonstrations in Paris and in cities and towns throughout the French mainland. More than 10,000 police and riot troops stood guard at strategic spots around Paris during the day to put teeth into the government's order.

The fast-developing events came as France appeared close to civil war.

The order from Pflimin came a few hours after he won approval from the National Assembly as the coun-

try's 27th postwar premier, at least temporarily giving France a government to cope with one of its gravest political crises to date.

Assuming Powers

The Pflimin order was issued here shortly after Salan himself had announced in Algiers that he was assuming "provisional" civil and military powers throughout the North African territory.

But even as the Pflimin government was acting to ease the situation, new anti-government demonstrations were shaping up in Algiers. By mid-morning a crowd of 2,000 was milling outside the French Command Headquarters there and nearly every

store in the city was shut for the second day in a row. The milling crowd was reported growing larger every minute. In Algiers, Gen. Jacques Massu, tough veteran paratrooper, called the Pflimin cabinet a "government of abandonment." Massu said his defiant army group would keep control of Algeria "until final victory."

Massu, apparently with the backing of Salan, broadcast over Algiers Radio this morning a violent speech in which he apparently closed all exits for a peaceful settlement.

The County Clerk's Office is one of the most important offices in the County Government.

The titles to your property, are all kept in the Clerk's Office recording department.

All County Bills and all payments of County Employees after authorization by the County Court are attended to in the Auditing Department of the Clerk's Office.

All voting records and all Election proceedings are carried on in the Election Department of the County Clerk's Office.

All records of litigation of various types, as divorce cases, damage cases, suits to quiet titles, criminal cases, and all cases going before the District Court, and the Circuit Courts are kept in the County Clerk's Office.

All records of Estates of Deceased persons, Guardianships, Adoptions and Juvenile cases are filed in the County Clerk's Office.

If you wish to obtain a delayed birth certificate you contact the County Clerk's Office.

If you need a marriage license, you obtain it in the County Clerk's Office.

If you wish to become a naturalized citizen of the United States, this is accomplished through the County Clerk's Office.

If you desire to take a trip to a foreign country your Passport Application is filled out in the County Clerk's Office.

If you may need to send a loved one to the Mental Hospital, the necessary papers are taken care of in the County Clerk's Office.

All Physicians and Surgeons practicing in Jackson County, record their licenses in the County Clerk's Office.

All Dentists, Optometrists, Osteopaths, and registered Nurses' Certificates are recorded in the County Clerk's Office. Ministers' Ordination Certificates are also recorded in the County Clerk's Office.

If you wish to record an Assumed Name or Articles of Incorporation for your business, this is done in the County Clerk's Office.

All Federal and State Tax liens and property liens are recorded in the County Clerk's Office.

All judgments filed against your property are filed in the Clerk's Office.
