**Nixon's Experiences
Seen as Long-Run
Boon for Relations**

Washington — Vice President Richard M. Nixon's violence-marred trip through South America has been a personal triumph for Nixon and perhaps a long-run boon to U.S.-Latin American relations. U.S. experts won't be sure until all returns are in whether Nixon scored a diplomatic coup or caused a setback for U.S. diplomacy. But they think the net result will be to improve deteriorating relations with Latin America.

**Need To Improve
Water Conditions
Noted By Bristol**

Need to leave water in the side streams and to obtain irrigation supply from other sources in order to build up the flow of Rogue river and improve fishing conditions was brought out to Medford Kiwanis club members yesterday by F. I. Bristol, state representative from Josephine county. Bristol, who is a member of the board of the Rogue River Basin Flood Control Resources association, addressed Kiwanians at their noon luncheon at Rogue Valley Country club. The talk was in connection with National Conservation week.

Engineering Study
The representative spoke of the idea, backed by engineering study, that floods on the Rogue cannot be controlled unless there is a big dam near the headwaters of the Rogue. The water now for fishing as it was known 30 years ago, Bristol stated. He pointed to the wide fame of the stream for its salmon and steelhead fishing and of its attraction to famous personalities. The speaker reported that there were once seven fish hatcheries on the Rogue. When the stream was closed to commercial fishing, it was thought that natural propagation would maintain the fishing but the stream began to decline. Bristol declared, however, that the decline was caused more by the lack of good and cool water for the salmon and steelhead.

**Bianconi To Attend
Portland Meeting**

Jerry V. Bianconi, Jackson county veterans' service officer, will attend the 21st annual county service officers' conference in Portland May 21-23. Members of the conference will discuss changes in the veteran laws, regulations and benefits. A panel discussion on admission requirements and treatment of veterans in Oregon and Washington hospitals also is planned, he noted. Other topics to be covered will be on the farm and home loan program, federal GI loans, state and federal educational benefits, outpatient medical care, reemployment rights of returning servicemen and veteran civil preference.
