

Terrorists Bomb Shop in Lebanon

Beirut, Lebanon — Terrorists bombed a coffee shop in Beirut's main square Thursday in a new eruption of violence in the struggle to oust pro-western President Camille Chamoun.

The army immediately blocked off the area. Unconfirmed reports said between 12 and 14 persons were killed, the gravest of several sporadic clashes and bombings reported today.

In Cairo, the semi-official Middle East News Agency said in a dispatch from Damascus that Lebanese rebels had seized the government's summer headquarters some 30 miles from Beirut.

'Side Effects' Of Drive Seen

Noticeable favorable "side effects" to the "You Auto Buy Now" campaign conducted May 1 to 10 by Medford auto dealers have been reported as a result of the sales program, those in charge said Thursday.

As examples, they cited a jewelry store which had a business increase of 28 per cent during the 10-day period compared to the first 10 days in May last year; and a men's clothing store which was 9.75 per cent behind in its April business, but which picked up during the May 1 to 10 period to a point 23.1 per cent ahead of last year.

A Medford department store reported the first 10 days in May ran 34 per cent ahead of the first 10 days of April, and that the May 1 to 10 period was 18 per cent above the same period a year ago, which was 10 per cent over the normal seasonal increase.

Auto service business ran an average of 27 per cent higher than the first 10 days of May in 1957, the reports indicated.

Bakery Workers Get Pay Increase

San Francisco — The International Bakery and Confectionery Workers union has negotiated the largest package wage increase in the history of the industry on the Pacific Coast.

The tentative agreement calls for total wage increases of \$10.25 a week by next May 1 for 18,000 bakery workers in California, Oregon and Washington.

Workers in San Francisco, Fresno and Long Beach are not affected. Locals in those cities joined the AFL-CIO sponsored American Bakery and Confectionery Workers union after the IBCW was expelled on corruption charges.

The new pay scale calls for a \$3.50 weekly raise retroactive to the first of this month; a \$3.50 increase next Feb. 1 and \$3.25 next May 1. The scale for workers now is \$95.70 for a 35-hour week.

Western Airlines Pays Stock Dividend

Los Angeles — Western Airlines paid its regular 20-cent dividend to stockholders Thursday despite a shutdown in operations caused by a pilots' strike that began Feb. 21. The airline reported an operating loss of \$524,137 in the first quarter but realized a net income of \$135,863 as a result of the sale of used aircraft.

Salem — Bids on \$7,600,000 in highway projects will be opened by the State Highway commission here on May 29.

A Huge Tumor

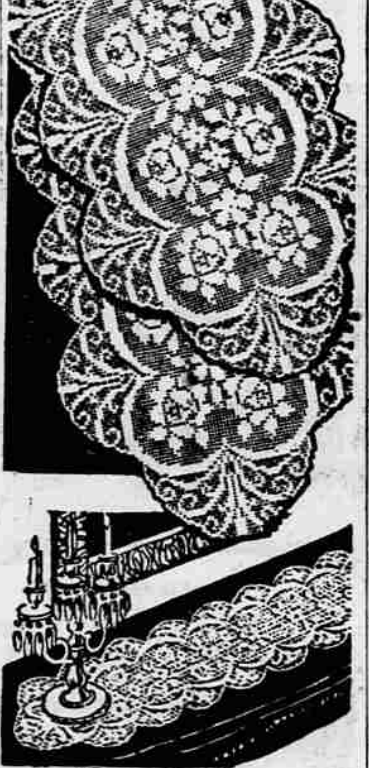
In the old days when surgery had a good many dangers attached to it, doctors used to see, especially in foreign lands and remote districts in this country, I remember when I was a medical student, 54 years ago, seeing a Chinese come into the Stanford Clinic carrying in front of him a huge tumor which had originated in his groin. He had it in a wheelbarrow which he pushed ahead of him. Another Chinese came in, staggering under a huge fatty tumor which he had on his back. One can understand how these foreigners had, for many years, felt disinclined to trust to the American doctor's surgery.

All of this was in mind today as I re-read the account of an ovarian tumor, weighing 184 pounds which was removed a few years ago by Dr. D. H. James Jr. The woman was 44. One would think she might have gotten the prize for the biggest ovarian tumor ever removed, but no; hers was only the 13th largest reported.

I always marvel at the psychology of a person who will go on for many years dragging around a tumor like that. The Prayer of Maimonides.

The most beautiful prayer ever composed for physicians came from Maimonides, who was a celebrated doctor of the 12th century. He was a court physician to the Sultan Saladin. He was a legislator, a
