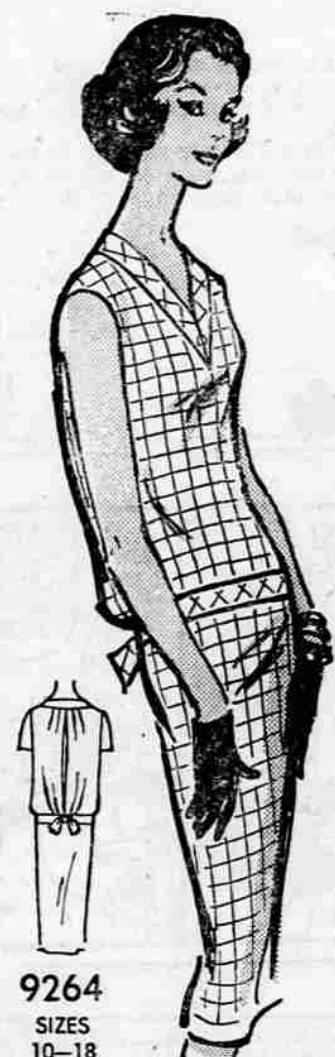

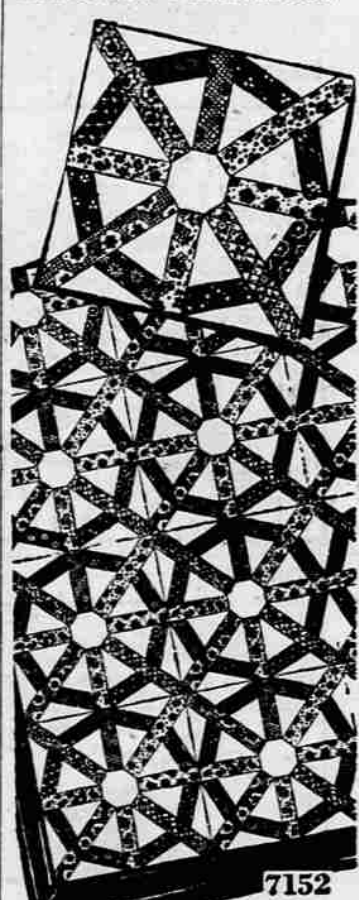
Polka Dots to Play For Dance at Camp
