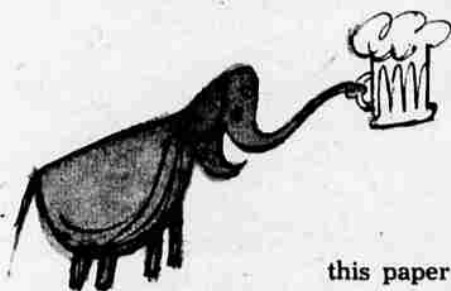


Nonsense. U.S.A.

But the skin of the thing that made her go."



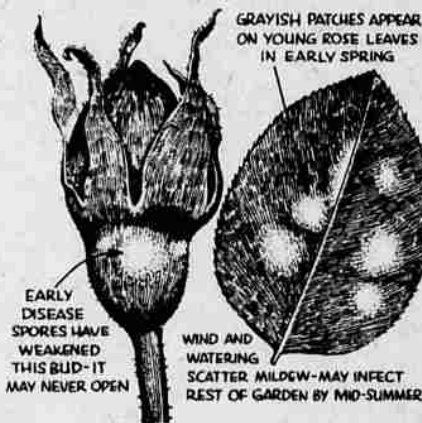
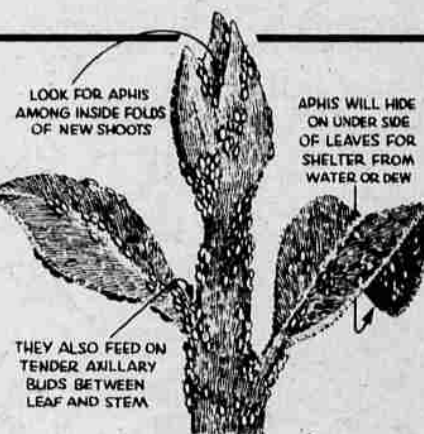
