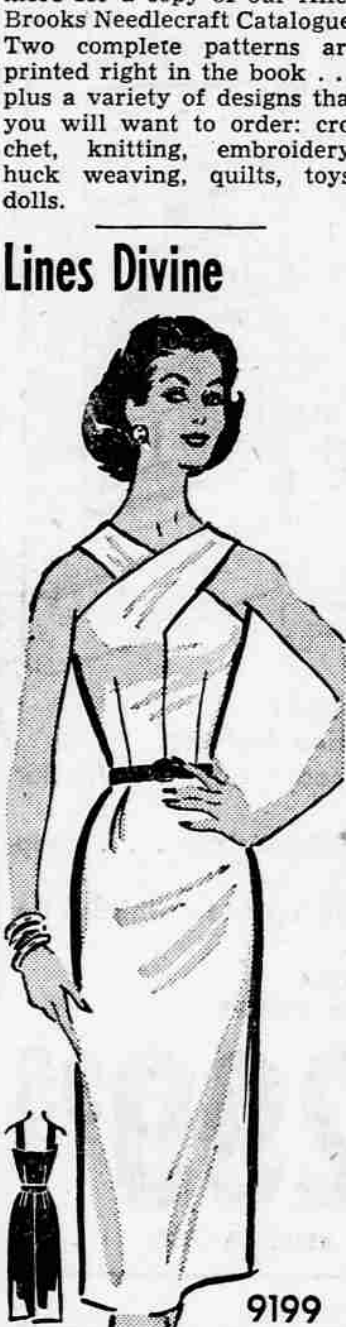

The Medical Roundup

Probably few people realize how many years go into the training of a good medical specialist. After graduating from high school, the lad (or young woman) must study three or four years in a university, learning something about the "basic sciences," such as mathematics, chemistry, physics, anatomy (the structure of the body), embryology (the growth of the body in the womb), histology (the microscopic structure of the body), physiology (the functioning of the body), and biochemistry (the chemistry of the body).

After this, the student has two years in which he is introduced to most of the basic problems of medicine. Then, for two years, he goes each day into a big hospital and studies disease in patients as well as in books. After that, if he has done well, he probably will graduate and get his M.D. degree. In some states, if next he passes his state board examinations he is licensed to go out and practice medicine and surgery.

Lives in Hospital

In a few universities he does not get his M.D. until he has had a year of internship, during which time he lives in a hospital, and does much of the examining and treating of patients—under the supervision of the physicians on the staff. As one can well imagine, this intern year is likely to be the most instructive of all that the man has had so far.

It is during this year that the young physician may decide, and often does decide, what specialty he is going to follow if any. When he leaves the hospital, he can open an office and do general practice, or he can make the big decision whether to work on toward a diploma in internal medicine, surgery, or some other one of the several specialties. Some men (and women) who, perhaps because of their temperament, prefer not to go out on their own to build a private practice, will go into any one of a number of specialties in which they can take a salaried position in some institution. In such work, they may not even see patients.

Many of the best men, at the end of their intern year,

take another year of residency, usually in a special field. After that, a man who wants to become a good specialist must settle down for at least three years in some good teaching institution. After this he may be permitted to take his National Board examinations, which, when passed, will give him a diploma, and the right to practice as a specialist.

Some surgeons, orthopedists, neurologists, and others keep studying for five years before they start out in practice, and after that able men keep studying hard all their days in order just to keep up with the new things that are constantly being discovered in medicine.

One can easily see why, today, many a young specialist cannot hope to open his first office until he is 30.
