**Ashlanders Oppose GP On Tuesday**

Grants Pass and Ashland High schools will play their Southern Oregon conference doubleheader at Ashland on Tuesday afternoon.

Only the first game counts in league standings. If Grants Pass is winner, it will be the conference and District 6 A-1 champion. However, if Ashland wins and Medford defeats Klamath Falls in other action this week, a play-off between Medford and Grants Pass will be required to determine the district representative in state eliminations.

State quarter-finals open on May 27.

Medford and Klamath Falls are to play Friday, according to original schedule but may also move their rivalry ahead.

The idea is that, should Medford and Grants Pass wind up tied, there will be time for the play-off and rest for pitchers before the state quarter-finals.

**Broiled Chicken Costs Victory**

New York—A broiled chicken may have cost the U.S. team a face-saving victory in its weight-lifting series with Russia.

Beaten 6-1 and 4-3 in two previous meets last week, the U.S. barbell crew split the first six matches against the Russian lifters in their final meet at Madison Square Garden Saturday night.

Then middle heavyweights Dave Sheppard of Washington, D.C., and Dr. Arkady Vorobyev took over for the final event which would decide the winner. Each totalled 1,002 3/4 pounds for the standard three lifts—press, clean-and-jerk and snatch. Under the rules of weightlifting, the decision goes to the lifter who weighed less.

Each weighed 197 3/4 pounds before the match, but in the post-match weigh-in, Vorobyev scaled 195 1/4 to Sheppard's 196 and thus was awarded the decision that gave the visitors their third straight victory.

Later it developed that Sheppard finished his lifting chores before Vorobyev, and, while waiting for his opponent to complete his lifts, stepped out for a snack, which consisted of a half chicken.

**Rawls Golf Won By Wiffi Smith**

Spartanburg, S.C.—Last week defending champion Betsy Rawls predicted that a 216 would win the sixth annual golf tournament that bears her name. And that was the score that won it Sunday for freckled Wiffi Smith.

The 21-year-old shotmaker from St. Clair, Mich., put a hot putter to work in the final round for a 72 that carried her past Beverly Hanson of Indio, Calif., and Mickey Wright of Chula Vista, Calif., in the Peach Blossom-Betsy Rawls event.

Miss Hanson closed out with a 75. Her 54-hole score of 218 was good for second money. Miss Wright posted a 219 to tie Marlene Bauer Hagge of Del Ray Beach, Fla., for third place. Miss Hanson and Miss Wright had been tied for the lead at 143 going into the final.

**Sam Snead Winner in Own Meet**

White Sulphur Springs, W. Va.—Give a fellow like Sam Snead an inch and he'll take a mile. That's what Gary Player, the personable young South African, did Sunday and it cost him top place in the Sam Snead Golf tournament.

The first inch Player gave Snead was on the final hole of the 72-hole tournament. It was by that much the 22-year-old professional missed a putt that would have given him first place in the four-day tourney on Snead's home grounds.

When Player finished his fourth sub-par round with a four-under 66 it tied him and Snead for first with identical scores of 264, 16 under par. Snead had finished with a 67.

The second big inch given Snead by Player was on the fifth hole of a pressurized sudden death playoff. Player missed another five-foot putt by an inch. Snead was there this time to take advantage of it and knocked in one of three feet for a birdie on the par-four hole—and the championship.

Bantam Ben Hogan was third with 265. After sharing the lead for three rounds, he carded a 68 Sunday.
