took a two percentage-point first-place lead in the National league when they whipped the Chicago Cubs, 7-3 and 4-0, and the Cincinnati Redlegs beat the Milwaukee Braves, 11-7. The Giants, picked to finish sixth by the experts, lead the Braves, .656 to .654. They have won three straight and 11 of their last 14 games.

Sweeps Due To Pitching
Brilliant pitching was the key to both sweeps. Sal Maglie needed only Ryne Duren's ninth-inning help to win the opener for the Yankees and then Bob Turley "bombed," the Senators with a five-hit compared to second-placer Kansas City's 13-12 record.

The Yankees, who look like they're going to make Casey Stengel's ninth pennant in 10 years his easiest, ballooned their AL lead to 6 1/2 games Sunday with 5-2 and 3-0 victories over the Washington Senators. The Yankees, with six straight and 10 of 11, are 14 games over .500 at 195-146 compared to second-placer Kansas City's 13-12 record.

Washington led the field in first places with six, followed by Oregon with five. Washington State got three and Idaho got one.

Overall Depth
The Ducks displayed overall depth and power to win the meet. Oregon took six second places and nearly swept the field in the 100-yard dash when Jack Morris, Otis Davis and Steve Anderson finished in a three-way dead heat in 10 seconds flat.

Other Oregon firsts were by Dave Edstrom, who had 9 1/2 points, in the high hurdles; Otis Davis, who had 8 points, in the 220; and Ken Grant in the high jump.

Steven Anderson, the versatile Oregon junior, had 12 points.

Duane Marshall was the leading Oregon Stater with a third in the shot.

The Athletics moved into second place in the AL by defeating the Detroit Tigers, 2-0, the Boston Red Sox downed the Baltimore Orioles 8-4, and the Cleveland Indians swept the Chicago White Sox, 7-4 and 10-6, in the other American league games.

In the National, the Philadelphia Phillies continued the deflation of the Pittsburgh Pirates with a 6-4 and 6-2 victories while the Los Angeles Dodgers rebounded from a 6-5 loss to beat the St. Louis Cardinals, 4-0.

Homer by Maglie
Maglie, making his first start, limited the Senators to seven hits in eight innings and also highlighted the Yank attack with a three-run homer to climax New York's five-run fourth inning burst.

Danny O'Connell and Willie Kirkland each had three hits and drove in three runs to lead the Giants 11-hit attack in the opener and O'Connell also had three hits in the nightcap.

Duke Maas faced only 28 Tigers in a two-hitter to give the Athletics their fourth straight win and Detroit its fifth consecutive loss. All three Athletic hits were doubles, two by Vic Power and Frank House combining with a walk and an error to produce two runs in the second inning.

Dick Gernert hit two homers and a double to knock in four runs and Jackie Jensen drove in three with a homer and three singles in powering the Red Sox to their fourth victory in five games.

White Sox leads in both games, winning the 11-inning opener on pinch-hitter Carol Hardy's three run homer and the nightcap with two runs in the sixth and three in the seventh. Godih in New York Debut On Friday Against Busso

New York — Light-weight Lahouari Godih of Algeria makes his New York debut Friday night in a TV 10-rounder with Johnny Busso boxing returns to Madison Square Garden after an absence of eight weeks.

Godih, lightweight champion of France, made such an impressive American debut at Washington, D.C., on April 18 that he is now rated at "even money" against Busso of New York. Godih outpointed Larry Baker at Washington.

The Busso-Godih bout will be televised and broadcast nationally by NBC.

Manager Red Davis' crew took over first place in the Pacific Coast league by sweeping a double header from the Portland Beavers Sunday night by scores of 4-1 and 12-5.

The twin triumph also gave the Little Giants a 7-0 series sweep over the Beavers who sagged into last place.

Tonight Phoenix takes on Seattle with ancient Max Surkont (1-2) scheduled to face Jim Daxler (1-2) of the Rainiers.
